Following recent developments in Turkey, <u>the Council</u> discussed draft Council conclusions which were adopted as set out in 11368/16.

4. Fight against terrorism

At the request of the French delegation <u>the Council</u> discussed fight against terrorism. <u>France</u> renewed its call for more support under Article 42.7 TEU already invoked in November.

5. China

<u>The Council</u> took note of the debrief by the High Representative and the Commission on the EU-China Summit on 12-13 July 2016.

<u>The Council</u> also discussed and adopted Council conclusions on the EU strategy on China, welcoming the Joint Communication from the High Representative and the Commission of 7 June 2016. <u>The Council</u> agreed the strategy provided the policy framework for the EU engagement with China over the coming years.

6. Latin America and the Caribbean

<u>Ministers</u> had an exchange of views on recent developments in the region covering Venezuela, Cuba, Colombia, Argentina, the EU-CELAC Ministerial meeting and Ecuador. The <u>HR</u> called for participation at the EU-CELAC Ministerial in October.

Concerning Cuba, the <u>HR</u> announced that proposals to repeal the 1996 Common Position and to recommend to the Council the signature of the Political Dialogue and Cooperation Agreement (PDCA) would be transmitted in parallel to the Council.

The Council adopted Conclusions on Venezuela (11264/16).

7. Migration

<u>The Council</u> took note of the announcement by the High Representative that she would inform it in writing about the ongoing follow-up to the European Council conclusions of 28 June 2016 on external aspects of migration.

8. Any other business

The <u>Slovak delegation</u> drew the attention to recent positive developments in BiH with the initialing of the Stabilisation and Association Agreement adaptation to take account of the accession of Croatia to the EU; it called to encourage BiH to take positive steps on the EU coordination mechanism. Slovakia was looking favourably at possible Council conclusions on BiH's membership application at the GAC in September, provided that the conditions were met.
