On the basis of a Joint Consultation Paper from the Commission and the European External Action Service adopted on 6 October 2015 (doc. 12797/15), the Council held a preliminary exchange of views on the future of the European Union's relations with the African, Caribbean and Pacific countries after the expiry of the Cotonou Partnership Agreement in 2020. The Council agreed to revert to the subject at a later stage.

## 7. Any other business

#### Middle East Peace Process

In light of the recent escalation of violence on the ground, the <u>High Representative</u> informed Ministers about her contacts with the Israeli Prime Minister and the President of the Palestinian Authority.

## Belarus elections

Awaiting for OSCE preliminary assessment, the <u>High Representative</u> recalled earlier informal discussions on the EU reaction to the release of political prisoners in Belarus.

#### Ankara attacks

The <u>High Representative</u> expressed its condolences to the victims and recalled the utmost importance of protecting the electoral process, the intensification of dialogue with Turkey, and the need to encourage to re-start the peace process.

## ASEM Ministerial

The <u>High Representative</u> invited Ministers to attend in number the upcoming meeting of ASEM Foreign Ministers on 5-6 November in Luxembourg given the expected good participation on Asian side.

## **Ad "A" item 2:**

#### **Relations with Armenia**

## STATEMENT BY LITHUANIA

"Lithuania considers the provision of the preamble of the negotiating directives, stating that "The preamble will refer, inter alia, to: (...) the Parties' need to take into account their existing international obligations" to be relevant in the process of negotiations between the Parties, but not to be understood as having effect on the application of any provision of the future Framework Agreement."

As a general principle Hungary does not support the incorporation of provisions on investment protection in political agreements. If common accord is found in the Council to start negotiations on investment protection with Armenia, those should aim at establishing a stand-alone bilateral treaty on investment.

If and when common accord is found on the desirability to start negotiations on investment protection with Armenia, the negotiating directives set out in paragraph 33 will need to be discussed in detail and modified if necessary."

#### STATEMENT BY THE COMMISSION

"The Commission considers that the "Decision of the Representatives of the Governments of the Member States, meeting within the Council, authorising the European Commission to open negotiations, on behalf of the Member States, on the provisions that fall within the competence of the Member States, of a Framework Agreement between the European Union and its Member States, of the one part, and the Republic of Armenia, of the other part" is unwarranted because the Commission aims to conduct Framework Agreement negotiations with Armenia exclusively within the framework of the EU competencies as defined by the Treaty on European Union and the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union."

#### STATEMENT BY SPAIN

Decision of the representatives of the governments of the Member States, meeting within the Council authorising the European Commission to open negotiations on and negotiate, on behalf of the Member States, the provisions that fall within the competence of the Member States of a Framework Agreement between the European Union and the European Atomic Energy Community and their Member states, of the one part, and the Republic of Armenia, of the other part.

Spain makes the following statement on the adoption of the above referenced Decision.

"This Decision was drawn up as the Council considers that the negotiating mandate for the Framework Agreement covers areas falling within Member State competence as well as shared EU and Member State competence. Spain considers that the Commission by this Decision is mandated to conduct Framework Agreement negotiations with Armenia to the full extent of the negotiating mandate, including matters falling within Member State competence."

#### STATEMENT BY THE COMMISSION

on the modification by the Council of the Commission's recommendation for the Directives for the negotiation of a Framework Agreement with the Republic of Armenia

"The Commission takes note of the modifications by the Council of the Commission's recommendation for negotiating directives, in particular as regards the decision that negotiations on investment protection can only be launched no earlier than one year after the start of negotiations on a Framework Agreement with Armenia and only following agreement by the Council on the basis of a Commission review of the investment legal framework in Armenia. The Commission reserves the right to recommend at any point in the future a modification of the negotiating directives, in order to include investment protection, in accordance with the Treaty provisions on Common Commercial Policy and notably Article 207 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union.

The Commission also recalls that, in requesting authorisation to negotiate on investment, it must be guided by Regulation (EU) No 1219/2012, under which Member States' bilateral investment treaties with third countries should not constitute a serious obstacle to the negotiation or conclusion by the Union of bilateral investment agreements with third countries.

The Commission takes note of the Council's request that Commission should present a review of the investment legal framework in Armenia, identifying barriers on investment and setting out the reasons for starting negotiations to address such barriers. It should nevertheless be stressed that such requests, even when included in a Council's decision, cannot limit the Commission's right of initiative as foreseen in the Treaty, notably under the Common Commercial Policy."
