- 1. On 31 January 2013 the Commission sent its proposal¹, based on Article 91(1) of the TFEU, to the Council.
- 2. The European Economic and Social Committee delivered its opinion on 10 July 2013². The Committee of the Regions delivered its opinion on 8 October 2013³.
- 3. The European Parliament adopted its position at first reading on 26 February 2014⁴.

- 4. In accordance with the provisions of Article 294 of the TFEU and the "Joint Declaration on practical arrangements for the codecision procedure"¹, a number of informal contacts have taken place between the Council, the European Parliament and the Commission, resulting in an agreement on the text of the Council's position at first reading².
- 5. The Permanent Representatives Committee is asked to suggest that the Council:
 - adopt the Council's position at first reading as set out in 10580/15 and the statement of reasons as set out in 10580/15 ADD 1 as an "A" item at a forthcoming meeting, with the Polish delegation abstaining and the British delegation voting against;
 - order that the statements in Addenda 1 and 2 to this note be entered in the minutes of that meeting;
 - decide to publish the statement set out in Addendum 1 in the Official Journal of the European Union together with the legislative act.
