## 8<sup>TH</sup> SUMMIT OF ACP HEADS OF STATE AND GOVERNMENT

The ACP Council of Ministers,

Meeting in Brussels, (Belgium), from 24<sup>th</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> November 2015,

**HAVING REGARD** to Article 7 of the Georgetown Agreement on the Summit of ACP Heads of State and Government;

**HAVING REGARD** to Paragraph 38 of the Libreville Declaration in which ACP Heads of State and Government, meeting at their first Summit in Libreville, Gabon, on 6<sup>TH</sup> and 7<sup>TH</sup> November 1997, undertook to meet on a regular basis and mandated the Council of Ministers to make the necessary arrangements to this end;

**HAVING REGARD** to Paragraph 71 of the Sipopo Declaration and Decision No. 2/XVI/12 of the 7<sup>th</sup> Summit of ACP Heads of State and Government regarding the presentation, at the 8<sup>th</sup> Summit of Heads of State and Government, of the outcome of the work of the Committee of Ambassadors' Working Group and the Eminent Persons Group tasked with reflecting on the future of the ACP Group;

HAVING EXAMINED the progress report of the Ambassadorial Working Group on the Future Perspectives of the ACP Group as contained in (Document ACP/27/041/13 Rev.2) and the progress report on the ACP Eminent Persons Group on the future of the ACP Group as presented in the Secretary-General's report to Council (Document ACP/11/007/13);

**HAVING EXAMINED** the report of the Committee of Ambassadors to Council, in particular the Addendum on Preparations for the 8<sup>th</sup> Summil on ACP Heads of State and Government under the theme : "Repositioning the ACP Group to respond to the challenges of Sustainable Development" contained in document (ACP/28/020/15 Rev1)

#### HEREBY DECIDES TO:

**HAVING REGARD TO** Decision NO. 4/CI/15 of the 101<sup>st</sup> session of the ACP Council of Ministers regarding funding for a new building for the Heodquarters of the ACP Group;

**HAVING REGARD TO** the Contribution Agreement signed by the Committee of Ambassadors to avoid losing the funds earmarked for the ACP House;

**RECALLING** the technical and financial considerations advanced in favour of ACP Group's preferred option of a "turn-key" building on a new plot of land;

**NOTING** the European Commission's decision for a more extensive renovation of the current building;

**ACKNOWLEDGING** the in-depth dialogue between the ACP Group and the European Commission;

### HEREBY DECIDES

- 1. To approve the recommendation for a more extensive renovation;
- 2. **Mandate** the Committee of Ambassadors to meet with the European Commission to further discuss and to agree on the implementation action plan including the timeframes for the ACP building.

## ACP PRIVATE SECTOR DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY 2019

#### The ACP Council of Ministers,

Meeting in Brussels, (Belgium), from 24th to 25th November 2015,

**CONSIDERING** the resolution of the 101<sup>st</sup> session of the ACP Council of Ministers held in Brussels, Belgium on 26, 27 and 29 May 2015, on the orderly closure of the Centre for the Development of Enterprise (CDE) and the selling up of the Light Structure for ACP private sector development support;

**CONSIDERING** the ACP strategy for private sector development adopted by the ACP Council of Ministers on 12 December 2015 during its 100th session held in Brussels, Belgium [ACP/85/070/14];

**RECALLING** Decision no. 6/XCIX/14 on the Centre for the Development of Enterprise, adopted by the ACP Council of Ministers during its 99th session in Nairobi, Konya on 18 June 2014;

**RECALLING** Decision no. 7/XCIX/14 on the joint ACP-EU Cooperation Framework for private sector development support in ACP countries, adopted by the ACP Council of Ministers during its 99th session held in Nairobi, Kenya on 18 June 2014;

**UNDERSCORING** the compromise reached between ACP and EU Ministers during the 39th session of the joint Council of Ministers held in Nairobi, in June 2014, on the concurrence of the orderly closure of the CDE and the setting up of a light structure capable of adequately meeting the needs of the ACP private sector, while safeguarding the gains and the best practices of the CDE;

**REITERATING** the urgency of setting up an ACP-EU platform for private sector development in preparation for the creation of a Light Structure able to adequately meet the needs of the ACP private sector while safeguarding the gains and the best practices of the CDE;

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**REAFFIRMING** the crucial role of the private sector in the economic and social development of ACP States and regions;

**HAVING EXAMINED** the report of the Committee of Ambassadors on the ACP strategy for the development of the ACP private sector and moving forward the orderly closure of the CDE presented during the 102nd session of the Council of Ministers;

### HEREBY DECIDES:

- To approve the ACP Concept Note on the Light Structure [ACP/85/021/15 Final] as well as the Concept Note on the appointment of Regional Focal Points for ACP private sector support [ACP/85/052/15 Final]; and
- 2. To instruct the ACP Committee of Ambassadors to engage in negotiations with the European side, as soon as possible, with a view to making all the necessary arrangements for the speedy setting-up of a Light Structure, by including all the stakeholders, in particular, the Regional Integration Organisations and their specialised structures, intermediary private-sector regional and national organisations, and development partners.
