- On 13 December 2012 <u>the Commission</u> sent the above proposal¹, based on Article 81 TFEU^{2 3}, to the Council.
- 2. <u>The European Economic and Social Committee</u> delivered its opinion on 22 May 2013⁴.
- 3. <u>The European Parliament</u> adopted its position at first reading on 5 February 2014⁵.

- 4. At its 3354th meeting on 4 December 2014, <u>the Council</u> (Justice and Home Affairs) reached political agreement on the Council's position at first reading on the above Regulation¹.
- 5. <u>The Permanent Representatives Committee</u> is asked to suggest that the Council adopt its position at first reading set out in 16636/14 and the statement of reasons set out in 16636/14 ADD 1 as an "A" item at a forthcoming meeting.
