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Introduction.

 The principle of subsidiarity is defined in Article 5(3) of the Treaty on Burgean Union (TEU) as follows:

*Under the principle of subsidiarity, in areas which object tall within its exclusive competence, the Union shall act only if and insofar as the objectives of the proposed action cannot be sufficiently achieved by the lifewher States, either at central level or at regional and local level, but can rather, by reason of the scale or effects of the proposed action, be better achieved at Union level!

Article 5(3) also gives specific responsibility to national partiaments to ensure that EU institutions apply the principle in accordance with Protocol 2 on the application of the principles of substitiarity and proportionality.

- The lest established by Article S(3) TEU is, in effect, a "comparative
 efficiency" exercise, involving a "necessity" lest and a "greater benefits" lest:
 - i. Nacessity: Is action by the EU necessary blackieue the objectue of the proposal? Can the objectue of the proposal only be achieued, or achieued to a suntident extent, by EU action?
 - II. *Overster Benefits* Would the objective be belief activeed at EU level i.e. would EU action provide greater benefits than action at Member States level?
- To assist national parliaments in their evaluation of subsidiarity compilance,
 Article 5 of Protocol 2 provides explicitly that

"Any chaft legislative act should contain a detailed statement making it possible to appraise compliance with the principles of subsidiarity and proportionality. This statement should contain some assessment of the proposal's financial impact and, in the case of a directive, of its implications for the rules to be put in place by Wember States..."

- Therefore, any new draft legislature act;
 - must be supported by a sufficiently 'detailed statement' to allow a
 fudgment to be made by national parliaments on its compilance
 with the principle of subsidiarity;
 - must clearly satisfy both the necessity and greater benefit its is;
 and
 - II. must, under the principle of conterral set down in Article S(2) of the TEU, show that the Union Islacting 'only within the times of the competences confered upon it by the Wember States in the Treaties to attain the objectives set out therein."
- Scrutiny of the Joint Committee on Transport and Communications
 - 5. The Joint Committee on Transport and Communications thereafter referred to as the "Committee") scrutinised the following six proposals at two meetings, on 13 0 clotter 2021 and 21 0 clotter 2021
 - CO M(2021) 952: Proposal for a Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Directive 2003/87/EC as regards autation's contribution to the Union's economy-wide emission reduction target and appropriately implementing agricular market based measure.
 - > C0 M(2021) 996: Proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Regulation (Ell) 2019/631 as regards strengthening the C02 emission performance standards for new passenger cars and new light commercial vehicles in line with the Union's increased climate ambilion.
 - > C0 M(2021) 959: Proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on the deployment of atternature fuels initias fructure, and repeating Directive 2014/94/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council

- CO M(2021):561: Proposal for a Regulation of the Buropean Parliament and of the Council on ensuring a level playing field for sustainable at transport.
- CO M(2021)952: Proposal for a Regulation of the Buropean Parliament and of the Council on the use of renewable and low-carbon fuels in marilime transport and amending Directus 2009/16/80
- CO N(ZIIZ1) 957: Proposal for a Decision of the Buropean Parliament and of the Council amending Directive ZIIII 957/BC as regards the notification of offsetting in respect of a global market based measure for ahoran operators based in the Union.
- Following the Committee's consideration of these matters, it agreed a
 reasoned opinion on the proposals itsied about at its meeting on the 21
 0 clober 2021.
- 3. Opinion of the Joint Committee
 - 7. The Commiliee has had specific regard to the Treaty prouisions and is of the opinion that these proposals do not comply with the principles of subsidiarity.
 The reasons are set out in the following paragraph:
 - 3. The Commilies is of the opinion that the European Commission has not adequately med the procedural requirements (in Protocol 2, Article 5) to provide a detailed statement with sufficient quantitative and qualitative indicators, to allow national partiaments to fully assess all the implications of EU-wide proposals of his nature.

Recommendations of the Joint Committee

 The Commiliee agreed his Reportunder Dail Standing Order 133 and Seaned Standing Order 116 on 21 October 2021. 10.The Commillee, pursuant to Standing Orders, recommends the Reasoned Opinion contained in section 3 about for agreement by Dätland Seanad Breann.

Standing Orders 94, 95 and 96

Boop a and cointent of activities of Balact Committees.

- (ii) State bodies within the responsibility of such Department, and
- (b) the performance of anon-State body in retailors to an agreement for the production of seruloss that it has entered in lowth any such Godernment Department or State body.
- (2) A SelectiCommittee approached pursuant to this Standing Order shall also consider such other maillers which—
- (a) stand renamed to the Committee by white of these Standing Orders or statute taxu, or
