	- Adoption of the legislative act (LA + S)

- 1. On 3 February 2011, the Commission submitted its proposal¹, based on Article 82(1)(d) and Article 87(2)(a) TFEU², to the Council.
- The European Data Protection Supervisor delivered his opinion on 25 March 2011⁴.
 The European Economic and Social Committee delivered its opinion on 5 May 2011⁵.
 The Committee of the Regions was consulted.

- 3. The European Parliament adopted its position at first reading on the Commission proposal on 14 April 2016. The outcome of voting in the European Parliament reflects the compromise agreement reached between the institutions and should, therefore, be acceptable to the Council¹.
- 4. The Permanent Representatives Committee is therefore asked to confirm its agreement and to suggest that the Council:
 - approve the European Parliament's position as set out in PE-CONS 71/15 as an 'A' item at a forthcoming meeting;
 - order that the statement in the addendum to this note be entered in the minutes of that meeting.

If the Council approves the European Parliament's position, the legislative act will be adopted.

After being signed by the President of the European Parliament and the President of the Council, the legislative act will be published in the Official Journal of the European Union.
