Ġgantija Temples (a UNESCO World Heritage Site) Situated on the island of Gozo. Ġgantija is a megalithic temple complex dating to the Neolithic ages. It Is one of the world's oldest free-standing structures, as well as one of the oldest religious structures. Built approximately in the 36th century BC, ĠgantIja pre-dates Stonehenge and the Egyptian Pyramids.
