I refer to the provisions of Protocol No 21 of the Treaty of the European Union and to the Treaty on the Functioning for the European Union (on the position of the United Kingdom and Ireland in respect of the area of freedom, security and justice) and, in particular to Article 3.1 thereof, under which Ireland may notify the President of the Council in writing, within three months after a proposal or initiative has been presented to the Council pursuant to Title V of Part Three of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, that it wishes to take part in the adoption and application of any such proposed measure.
