Subject: Council Regulation amending Regulation (EU, Euratom) 2020/2093 laying down the multiannual financial framework for the years 2021–2027

Outcome of the written procedure initiated by CM 2140/26

– Adoption of the legislative act

Delegations are informed that the written procedure, opened by CM 2140/26 of 22 April 2026, and extended by CM 2140/1/26 REV 1, was completed on 23 April 2026 and that all delegations voted in favour of the adoption of the Council Regulation amending Regulation (EU, Euratom) 2020/2093 laying down the multiannual financial framework for the years 2021 to 2027, as set out in document ST 5470/26;

The required unanimity has been reached. Therefore, the above act is adopted.

The statement by the Netherlands, Austria, Belgium, Germany, Denmark, Finland, France, and Sweden is reproduced in the Annex to this CM.

The statement will be included in the summary of acts adopted by the written procedure as statements to be entered in the Council minutes, in accordance with the third subparagraph of Article 12(1) of the Council's Rules of Procedure.

**STATEMENT BY THE NETHERLANDS, AUSTRIA, BELGIUM, GERMANY,
DENMARK, FINLAND, FRANCE AND SWEDEN**

Given the urgency of Ukraine's financing needs, the Netherlands, Austria, Belgium, Germany, Denmark, Finland, France and Sweden strongly support the swift establishment of the Ukraine Support Loan. In this context, we welcome the Commission's commitment to finance the debt service costs of the Ukraine Support Loan in 2027 with budgetary availabilities first under the current MFF ceilings and then from existing special instruments. We reiterate the importance of faithful implementation of this commitment as part of the 2027 budget negotiations and will closely monitor all developments to ensure it is fully respected.
