Delegations are informed that the written procedure, opened by CM 2435/1/25 of 16 April 2025, was completed on 28 April 2025 at 15:00.

In relation to the Council decision on the position to be taken on behalf of the European Union within the Committee of the Parties of the Council of Europe Convention on preventing and combating violence against women and domestic violence on the amendments to the Committee's Rules of Procedure, with regard to matters related to institutions and public administration of the Union as set out in document 7294/25, one delegation abstained and 26 delegations voted in favour of its adoption.

As per to Council decision on the position to be taken on behalf of the European Union within the Committee of the Parties of the Council of Europe Convention on preventing and combating violence against women and domestic violence on the amendments to the Committee's Rules of Procedure, with regard to matters related to judicial cooperation in criminal matters, asylum and non-refoulement as set out in doc. 7295/25, one delegation abstained and 24 delegations voted in favour of its adoption.

The required qualified majority has been reached. Therefore, the above Council Decisions are adopted.
