Subject:	Extension of the mandate of the ad hoc Working Party on preparedness, response capability and resilience to future crises until 31 December 2023

1. On 13 December 2022, the Council (General Affairs) approved a Roadmap on strengthening crisis anticipation, preparedness and response in the Council (¹). The Roadmap comes in response to the Council conclusions of 23 November 2021 and takes a step-by-step approach to strengthening resilience and crisis management within the EU, while avoiding duplication and administrative burden, and without prejudging the outcome of subsequent discussions.

- 2. In order to take forward the work on individual tasks set out in the Roadmap and their concrete implementation, as well as continuing to assist Coreper in the work on follow-up to the Council conclusions of November 2021, the Presidency, in agreement with the incoming Spanish Presidency, considers that the mandate of the existing ad hoc Working Party should be further extended.
- 3. Given that the current mandate of the ad hoc Working Party is due to expire on 30 June 2023, the Presidency therefore proposes, in accordance with Article 19(3) of the Council's Rules of Procedure, to extend the mandate of the ad hoc Working Party on preparedness, response capability and resilience to future crises for another 6 months until 31 December 2023.
- 4. This ad hoc working group will continue to carry out its tasks under the terms of reference as set out in the Annex.
- 5. In view of the above remarks, Coreper is invited to approve:
 - the extension of the mandate of the ad hoc Working Party until 31 December 2023;
 - the terms of reference in the Annex
