Subject:	Submission by Lithuania for formal approval by the Council of draft design for 2 euro commemorative coin

1. Pursuant to Article 10 of Council Regulation (EU) No 729/2014 of 24 June 2014 on denominations and technical specifications of euro coins intended for circulation¹ (hereafter 'the Council Regulation'), Lithuania submits, through the General Secretariat of the Council, the draft design for:
 - a new 2 euro commemorative coin, intended to be issued in 2025, dedicated to the Lithuanian Minor (the draft design is set out in the Annex to the present note).
2. In accordance with Article 10(4) of the Council Regulation, any Member State whose currency is the euro may, in a reasoned opinion addressed to the Council and to the Commission, raise an objection to the draft design proposed by the issuing Member State if that draft design is likely to create adverse reactions among its citizens.

3. In accordance with Article 10(5) of the Council Regulation, where the Commission considers that the draft design does not respect the technical requirements set out by the Council Regulation, it shall submit a negative assessment to the Council.
4. If no reasoned opinion or negative assessment has been submitted to the Council by 26 June 2025, the decision approving the design shall be deemed to be adopted by the Council on the first day following the expiry of this time limit, pursuant to Article 10(6) of the Council Regulation.²
5. An Information Note to the Council acknowledging the end of this procedure and setting out the results will be issued by the General Secretariat of the Council.

**SUBMISSION OF THE DESIGN OF THE NATIONAL SIDE OF THE €2
COMMEMORATIVE COIN**

Dear all,

In accordance with Council Regulation (EU) No 729/2014 of 24 June 2014 and Regulation (EU) No 651/2012 of 4 July 2012, Lietuvos bankas hereby submits the design of the national side of the €2 commemorative coin dedicated to Lithuanian Minor (from the series "Lithuanian Ethnographic Regions"), which is intended to be issued in 2025.

The national side of the coin depicts the shield of the coat of arms, with a moose holding a spear in its forelegs and a shining lighthouse above it. Kurenkahns are on both sides of the shield, and below it appears a quote by Vydūnas: "Spindulys esmi begalinės šviesos" (A ray is the essence of infinite light).

The composition is surrounded by the inscriptions "Lietuva" (Lithuania), "Mažoji Lietuva" (Lithuania Minor), the year of issue (2025), and the mintmark of the Lithuanian Mint. The coin's outer ring bears the 12 stars of the EU flag.

The national side of the coin is designed by Rolandas Rimkūnas (author of the great coat of arms of the Lithuania Minor region Arvydas Každailis).

The edge of the coin will be the same as on the €2 circulation coins issued by Lietuvos bankas: LAISVĖ*VIENYBĖ*GEROVĖ*(FREEDOM*UNITY*WELL-BEING*).

The estimated mintage is 500,000 pcs, including 495,000 UNC-quality coins in rolls and 5,000 BU-quality coins in a numismatic package.

The foreseen date of issue is the fourth quarter of 2025.

In the event of a request for access to documents under Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, we allow EU institutions to disclose the submitted draft national design, and the correspondence

related thereto to the public prior to the publication of the final design in the Official Journal of the European Union.

Please find attached a copy of the coin design.
