**Statement by the Federal Republic of Germany on the revision of the Regulation on  
Classification, Labelling and Packaging of Substances and Mixtures (CLP)**

Germany considers that all information of relevance for consumer mixtures (in particular the hazard labelling and the constituent substances) must appear on the physical label in order to allow all population groups to have access to this important information.

We understand the reference in Article 53(1a) of the Presidency compromise on GHS labelling as meaning that, in the case of consumer mixtures, in addition to the hazard labelling, the constituent substances must also be indicated on the physical label and cannot be transferred to a purely digital label by means of a delegated act.

Against this background, Germany could agree to the compromise text.
