Following the events which occurred in London on 7 July, there are serious risks of a terrorist attack on French soil.

The French Government has therefore decided to reintroduce checks at land borders between France on the one hand and Germany, Spain and Italy on the other.

This measure will come into force for a one-month period from 8.00 on 9 July 2005.

In accordance with Decision SCH/COMEX 20 Rev 2 of 20 December 1995, I would be grateful if you could inform forthwith the members of the Council of the European Union (Justice and Home Affairs), the two member states of the Joint Committee which do not belong to the European Union, and the European Commission.

The French Government has contacted the authorities of the three Member States concerned to ensure that they assist in implementing this decision.
