Sugġett:	Pjanijiet tal-Eurojust għall-bidu ta' negozjati bil-ħsieb ta' dħul fi ftehim strateġiku mat-Tuneżija

1. Ittra mingħand il-President tal-Eurojust informat lill-Kunsill dwar il-proposta tal-Eurojust li fil-15 ta' Settembru 2018 jitnedew negozjati formali bl-intenzjoni ta' dħul fi ftehim ta' kooperazzjoni mat-Tuneżija, kif jinsab fl-Anness.
2. F'konformità mal-Artikolu 26a(2) tad-Deċiżjoni tal-Kunsill tat-28 ta' Frar 2002 li tistabbilixxi lill-Eurojust, kif emendata l-aħħar bid-Deċiżjoni tal-Kunsill 2009/426/ĠAI tas-16 ta' Diċembru 2008, il-Kunsill jista' jasal għal kwalunkwe konkluzjoni li hu jqis adattata rigward din il-proposta.
3. L-ittra ġiet diskussa mill-JAIEX fl-14 ta' Settembru 2018 u d-delegazzjonijiet qablu li l-Eurojust tibda negozjati bil-ħsieb ta' dħul fi ftehim strateġiku mat-Tuneżija.
4. Il-COREPER huwa mitlub jistieden lill-Kunsill jieħu nota tal-proposta tal-Eurojust li jitnedew negozjati formali bl-intenzjoni ta' dħul fi ftehim ta' kooperazzjoni mat-Tuneżija.

Eurojust's plans for commencing negotiations with a view to entering into a strategic agreement with Tunisia

Dear Mr Martschini,

In accordance with Article 26a(2), final sentence of the Council Decision of 28 February 2002 setting up Eurojust, as last amended by Council Decision 2009/426/JHA of 16 December 2008, I am pleased to inform you that Eurojust envisages launching formal negotiations on 15 September 2018 with the intention of entering into a strategic agreement with Tunisia.

This step forward follows the decision taken last year by the College of Eurojust to include Tunisia in its priority list of counterparts to explore the possibility of concluding an agreement allowing, *inter alia*, for the exchange of technical and strategic information (therefore not operational information, including personal data).

We look forward to receiving the conclusions deemed appropriate by the Council with respect to the above prior to the indicated commencement of negotiations.
