"In connection with the text proposal for a Council recommendation on a coordinated approach to the restriction of free movement in response to the COVID-19 pandemic Austria states the following:

Wherever possible, the preferred option should be to undergo a test.

Concerning the mapping of risk areas when considering restrictions of free movement, we state that Austria explicitly supports such a mapping in itself. However, the proposed thresholds and criteria absolutely need to be adapted in the near future, as they do not reflect the current epidemiological situation in most of the EU Member States and as the epidemiological situation is not expected to significantly change in the coming weeks and months.

The Austrian position on this Council recommendation therefore is: abstention."

Intervention by the Commission on the interpretation of "all or significant subset of CSRs"

"The Commission's position is that the recovery and resilience plans will need to reflect the relevant country-specific challenges and be aligned with the EU priorities in order to address key challenges in a comprehensive manner. This includes the country-specific recommendations addressed to the Member States in recent years and in particular in the 2019 and 2020 Semester cycles. When translating those recommendations into specific reforms and investments, Member States should focus on those challenges and priorities that will generate the most lasting impact and will strengthen the growth potential, job creation, health systems and economic and social resilience and regional cohesion of the Member State.

The Commission confirms that – in line with Art. 16(3) (c) of the proposed Regulation establishing a Recovery and Resilience Facility – the Commission will assess whether the recovery and resilience plan submitted by the Member State is expected to have a lasting impact on the Member State concerned.

The understanding of the Commission (based on the joint reading of Article 19a(1),(2b) and (3) of the RRF Regulation read in conjunction with recital 31a) is that the decision making process on payments and notably the need to take into account the EFC opinion respects the prerogatives of the Commission according to the Treaty."

Statement by Bulgaria, Hungary and Poland

"The concept of "relevant CSRs" is not a new one and it is used in the context of linking the cohesion policy with the sound economic governance. The notion of "relevant CSRs" has never been understood as "all CSRs" from a given year or years but as the CSRs that are applicable to areas of intervention of the cohesion policy.

In our view, the same rules shall apply to the Recovery and Resilience Facility since the main objective of the national Recovery and Resilience Plans is to implement structural reforms and boosting investments. The relevance of CSRs shall be assessed on a "case by case" basis, bilaterally between the European Commission and Member State concerned. Having in mind that major part of resources of the RRF shall be allocated to support green and digital transitions, a pragmatic and a strong recovery oriented approach towards the rest of CSRs must be applied."

Statement by Hungary

"Hungary remains dedicated to its human rights commitments, including the protection and promotion of women's rights and equality between men and women.

Hungary recognizes and promotes equality between men and women in accordance with the Fundamental Law of Hungary, principles and values of the European Union, as well as commitments and principles stemming from international law. Furthermore, equality between women and men is enshrined in the Treaties of the European Union as a fundamental value. In line with these and its national legislation, Hungary interprets the concept of „gender“ as reference to sex and concept of „gender equality“ as reference to the equality between women and men.

Hungary notes, that the term of “all gender” is lacking definition at international level, including within the European Union. Therefore, Hungary is not in the position to support the compromise."

Statement by Poland

"Equality between women and men is enshrined in the treaties of the European Union as a fundamental right. Poland ensures equality between women and men within the framework of the Polish national legal system in accordance with internationally binding human rights instruments and within the framework of fundamental values and principles of the European Union. For these reasons, in place where the decision refers to gender equality Poland will interpret it as a equality between women and men, according to Article 8 TFEU."

Statement by Slovakia

"The Slovak Republic recognizes and promotes equality between men and women in accordance with the Constitution of the Slovak Republic and primary law of the European Union. In this context, the Slovak Republic interprets the concept of „gender“ in the text of the Decision amending Decision No 573/2014/EU on cooperation between Public Employment Services (PES) as reference to sex and concept of „gender equality“ as reference to the equality between men and women."

"Italy deems that the process envisaged under Recital 11b and Article 23a(2)(bb) of the proposal amending the Regulation EU 2016/1011 is too complex and burdensome to be accomplished in a consistent manner; additionally, the designation of the "relevant authority" is vague and the power given to it is too intrusive with respect to the autonomy of counterparties to the contracts. For the mentioned reasons, Italy strongly favors either the deletion of such part of the proposal or its significant amendment in order to make it actually viable."

Statement by Germany

"Deutschland geht davon aus, dass die deutsche Fassung der Erwägungsgründe wie folgt geändert wird:

Bei Erwägungsgrund 1 und 3 wird jeweils „in Anhang XVII“ in „des Anhangs XVII“ geändert. In Erwägungsgrund 3 wird „Pentachlorophenol“ in „Pentachlorphenol“ geändert. In Fußnote 6 wird „von Anhang XVII“ in „zu Anhang XVII“ geändert. Der Erwägungsgrund 8 wird wie folgt gefasst: „Die Verordnung (EU) 2017/745 des Europäischen Parlaments und des Rates legt Vorschriften für das Inverkehrbringen, die Bereitstellung auf dem Markt oder die Inbetriebnahme von Medizinprodukten für den menschlichen Gebrauch, von Zubehör für solche Produkte und von bestimmten Produktgruppen ohne medizinische Zweckbestimmung

In Erwägungsgrund 12 wird das Wort „Nummerierung“ in „Nummerierungen“ geändert. In Erwägungsgrund 13 wird der zweite Satz wie folgt gefasst: „Mehrere der aufgeführten Prüfmethode sind veraltet und wurden durch das Europäische Komitee für Normung durch modernere Prüfmethode ersetzt.“

Ferner geht Deutschland davon aus, dass im Annex folgende Änderungen erfolgen:

Bei der Änderung b) wird im Unterpunkt a das Komma vor „Mit“ gestrichen. Die Formulierungen „Krebserzeugend“ werden überall durch „Krebserzeugende Stoffe“, „Keimzellenmutagene“ durch „Erbgutverändernde Stoffe“ und „Fortpflanzungsgefährdend“ durch „Fortpflanzungsgefährdende Stoffe“ ersetzt. Der Stoffname „Dibutylbis(pentan-2,4-dionato-O,O')tin“ wird in „Dibutylbis(pentan-2,4-dionato-O,O')zinn“ geändert. „Chemische Prüfungen – Bestimmung“ wird jeweils in „Chemische Prüfungen zur Bestimmung“ geändert. Beim Eintrag EN ISO 14362-1:2017 wird aus „Faser“ „Fasern“. Beim Eintrag EN ISO 14362-3:2017 wird der Begriff „gewisser“ durch „bestimmter“ ersetzt."

The second sentence of recital 13 will be worded as follows.: „Mehrere der aufgeführten Prüfmethode sind veraltet und wurden durch das Europäische Komitee für Normung durch modernere Prüfmethode ersetzt.“

Furthermore Germany assumes that the annex will contain the following changes:

In the changes of b) subpoint a the comma before „Mit“ will be deleted. The expressions „Krebserzeugend“ will everywhere be replaced by „Krebserzeugende Stoffe“, as well as „Keimzellenmutagene“ by „Erbgutverändernde Stoffe“ and „Fortpflanzungsgefährdend“ by „Fortpflanzungsgefährdende Stoffe“. The substance name „Dibutylbis(pentan-2,4-dionato-O,O')tin“ is changed to „Dibutylbis(pentan-2,4-dionato-O,O')zinn“. The expression „Chemische Prüfungen – Bestimmung“ is each time replaced by „Chemische Prüfungen zur Bestimmung“. In entry EN ISO 14362-1:2017 „Faser“ is changed to „Fasern“. In entry EN ISO 14362-3:2017 the expression „gewisser“ is replaced by „bestimmter“."
