	- Preparation for the trilogue

I. INTRODUCTION

1. On 25 November 2021, the <u>Commission</u> submitted to the European Parliament and the Council the proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on the transparency and targeting of political advertising (hereinafter referred to as the 'proposal')¹. This proposal is one of the elements of the 'Democracy and Integrity of EU elections' package (hereinafter referred to as the 'Democracy package').

- 2. The <u>European Economic and Social Committee</u> adopted its Opinion² on 27 February 2022.
- 3. On 21 December 2021, the <u>Committee of Permanent Representatives (Part 2)</u> agreed³ on the optional consultation of the <u>Committee of the Regions</u>. The <u>Committee of the Regions</u> adopted its Opinion⁴ at its plenary session of 27 28 April 2022.
- 4. The European Parliament adopted its report⁵ on 2 February 2023.
- 5. On 13 December 2022, the Council (General Affairs) reached a general approach⁶ which served as a mandate to enter into negotiations with the European Parliament on this proposal.

II. STATE OF PLAY OF INTER-INSTITUTIONAL NEGOTIATIONS

- 6. A <u>kick-off</u> trilogue meeting was held on 28 February 2023. Since then, three additional trilogue meetings have been held to date: 30 March, 5 May and 27 June. <u>Extensive</u> <u>discussions</u> on all provisions were held at the technical level with a view to prepare for trilogue meetings.
- 7. The last <u>state of play</u> of the interinstitutional negotiations, as confirmed by both colegislators at the fourth trilogue meeting⁷ was circulated on 28 June.
- 8. At the fourth trilogue meeting, the co-legislators agreed on the need for a <u>fifth</u> and <u>possibly decisive</u> trilogue meeting on 10 October 2023 with a view to reach a provisional agreement on the <u>outstanding political elements</u> of the proposal.

III. PREPARATORY WORK IN THE COUNCIL IN VIEW OF THE FIFTH TRILOGUE

- 9. Following the fourth trilogue meeting, the Presidency held seven meetings of the Working Party on General Affairs (GAG) on 6, 14, 20 July, 8, 15, 25 and 29 September 2023.
- 10. In light of the comments raised by delegations at the abovementioned meetings and in writing and in subsequent bilateral discussions, the <u>Presidency</u> suggests, in <u>Annex I</u> to this note and <u>as part of an overall compromise package</u>, possible <u>compromise proposals</u> on some <u>key</u> political elements to serve as a revised negotiating mandate for the fifth trilogue meeting. The proposed key changes to the Council's general approach are the following:
 - i. Scope of application of Chapter III (targeting of political advertising) (Article 2 rows 105 and 119): The Presidency proposes to agree to the Commission suggestion to address the differences between co-legislators on the scope of application of Chapter III in the definition of 'political advertising' (row 105) which would now include principally political advertising provided as a service, but also advertising prepared through in-house activities. Furthermore, the Presidency suggests including coordinated actions in the context of a political advertising campaign (row 119) to capture, in the scope of the measures on targeting, political advertising disseminated without payment through individual users or groups of individual users (trolls or troll farms) or relying on fake accounts to manipulate elections/referendums.
 - ii. **Ban on 3rd country sponsors** (Article 3a rows 129b-129c): The Presidency proposes a compromise text in Article 3a, and a new recital, with a view to address the European Parliament's concerns on <u>foreign interference</u> by introducing a targeted ban for 3rd country sponsors. In order to address the concerns of some delegations, the <u>Presidency</u> suggests text which <u>safeguards stricter national rules</u> where relevant. Article 5 would be amended to include an obligation on sponsors to declare the additional information.

- iii. **Non-discrimination clause** (Article 3a row 129d): The <u>Presidency</u> suggests a compromise proposal which recalls the <u>non-discrimination principle of the internal market</u>. This principle stipulates that services should not be restricted solely on the basis of place of residence or establishment of the service recipients, in this case the sponsor, including <u>European Political Parties</u> and <u>European Political Groups</u> in the European Parliament when acting as sponsors of political advertising.
- iv. Processing of personal data for targeting and amplification purposes (Articles 12 and 12 rows 193 205): The Presidency proposes a possible compromise text on the basis of the latest Commission suggestion. In particular, the Presidency suggests agreeing to the Commission proposal for Article -12 prohibiting the presentation of political advertisements online, on the basis of profiling using special categories of personal data, in line with the Digital Services Act (DSA). In addition, in Article 12, the Presidency suggests agreeing to the Commission's proposal to permit the processing of personal data only if the data was collected from the data subject and with the explicit consent by the data subject in line with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). Moreover, these provisions shall not apply to any communication of any political party, foundation, association or other non-profit body to members and former members on the basis of subscription.
- 11. Concerning the proposed **phased implementation** (Article 20), in light of the major reservations raised in GAG and during the bilateral discussions, the <u>Presidency</u> does not see any possible flexibility in this regard and proposes <u>to maintain</u> the text of the general approach; that is <u>12 months</u> after the publication in the Official Journal.
- 12. In addition, and for information purposes only, <u>delegations</u> will find in <u>Annex II</u> to this note, an <u>updated</u> and <u>informal</u> state of play of the negotiations reflecting the outcome of the technical discussions held since the fourth trilogue meeting to date. The changes to the former state of play⁸, will be provisionally confirmed by the co-legislators at the fifth trilogue meeting.

 <u>October</u>. Changes compared to the general approach are indicated in <u>bold underlined</u>

 <u>italics</u>. Deletions are also indicated in <u>strikethrough</u>.
- 14. The <u>Presidency</u> will report to this Committee on the outcome of the fifth trilogue meeting on 13 October.

Scope

Article 2

(row 105)

2. 'political advertising' means the preparation, placement, promotion, publication, delivery or dissemination, by any means, of a message, *normally provided for remuneration or*through in-house activities, or as part of a political advertising campaign:

6. 'political advertising campaign' means the preparation, placement, promotion, publication or dissemination of a series of linked political advertisements <u>in the course of a contract</u> <u>for political advertising</u>, on the basis of common preparation, sponsorship or funding or coordinated actions;

Addition to recital 15:

(row 25)

(15) There is no existing definition of political advertising or political advertisement at Union level. A common definition is needed to establish the scope of application of the harmonised transparency obligations and rules on targeting and amplification. This definition should cover the many forms that political advertising can take and any means and mode of publication or dissemination within the Union, regardless of whether the source is located within the Union or in a third country. *Political advertising should cover the preparation, placement, promotion, publication, delivery or dissemination, by any means, of a message in return for payment or for similar consideration, or through in-house activities. It should also include messages whose preparation, placement, promotion, publication, delivery or dissemination takes place as part of a political advertising campaign. This could encompass instances where advertisements show common preparation, placement, promotion, publication, delivery or dissemination, where there is common sponsorship or funding, or where one or several individuals follow a common plan or act in a concerted manner with the objective to influence the outcome of an election, referendum or regulatory process, for example by promoting or opposing a political actor, their ideas or a specific policy.*

Article 3a

 $(Rows\ 129b - 129c)$

- 1. Without prejudice to stricter national rules, in the last 3 months preceding an election or referendum organised at Union level or at national, regional or local level in a Member State, political advertising services pertaining to that election or referendum shall only be provided to a sponsor or service provider acting on behalf of a sponsor who declares itself to be:
 - i. a citizen of the Union,
 - ii. a third country national permanently residing in the Union and having a right to
 vote in that election or referendum in accordance with the national law of the

 Member State of residence, or
 - iii. a legal person established in the Union which is not ultimately owned or controlled by a third country national, with the exception of third country nationals referred to in point ii, or by a legal person established in a third country.

New recital:

Interference in elections by certain third country entities or third country nationals, who may sponsor political advertising in the Union, is known to pose a serious threat to democracy, which is a common value of the Union, the securing of which is of fundamental importance to the Union and its Member States. As such, it is necessary to provide for an obligation applying 3 months preceding an election or referendum organised at Union level or at national, regional or local level in a Member State to only provide political advertising services to a citizen of the Union, third country nationals permanently residing in the Union and having a right to vote in that election or referendum or legal persons established in the Union which is not controlled by third country entities. This should not preclude Member States from having stricter national rules.

2. Providers of political advertising services shall not restrict the provision of their services to a sponsor, including a European political party in the meaning of Regulation

1141/2014, or a political group in the European Parliament when acting as a sponsor of political advertising, solely on the basis of its place of residence or of establishment.

Article -12

(rows 193a – 193b)

Political advertising publishers shall not present political advertisements online based on profiling as defined in Article 4, point (4), of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 and in Article 5, point (4), of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 using special categories of personal data referred to in Article 9(1) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 and in Article 10(1) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725.

Article 12

(rows 193 - 205)

Specific requirements related to targeting and amplification

- 1. Targeting or amplification techniques that involve the processing of <u>special categories of</u> personal data <u>referred to in Article 9(1) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 and Article 10(1) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725</u> in the context of <u>online</u> political advertising <u>shall be</u> <u>permitted subject to the following conditions are prohibited</u>:
 - a. the controller collected the personal data from the data subject; and
 - b. the data subject has provided explicit consent within the meaning of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 and Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 to the processing of personal data separately for the purpose of political advertising;
- 2. Paragraph 1 The prohibition laid down in the first sentence shall not apply to the situations referred to in Article 9(2)(a) and (d) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 and Article 10(2)(a) and (d) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725. For the purposes of implementing this paragraph, the explicit consent within the meaning of Regulations (EU) 2016/679 and (EU) 2018/1725 shall been given separately and specifically for the purpose of political advertising.

- 2a. Paragraph 1 shall not apply to the situations referred to in Article 9(2)(d) of Regulation

 (EU) 2016/679 and Article 10(2)(d) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725.
- 2. Targeting or amplification techniques that involve the processing of personal data of a data subject that is known by the controller with reasonable certainty to be at least one year under the voting age established by national rules in the context of political advertising, are prohibited. Compliance with the obligations set out in this paragraph shall not oblige the controller to process additional personal data in order to assess whether the data subject is one year under the voting age.
- 3. Articles 12 and -12 shall not apply to communications of any political party,
 foundation, association or any other non-profit body, to their members and former
 members and to communications, such as newsletters, linked to their political activities,
 as long as those communications are solely based on subscription data and therefore
 strictly limited to their members, former members or subscribers and are based on
 personal data provided by them and do not involve processing of personal data to target
 or otherwise further select the recipients and the messages they receive.
