	- Preparation for the trilogue

1. In view of the second informal trilogue on 19 November 2019, delegations will find attached a revised 4-column document reflecting the state of play of negotiations on the Erasmus Regulation, as prepared by the Presidency. The document is based on the interinstitutional technical meetings held since the first trilogue (7 October 2019), namely on 16 and 25 October as well as the discussions held at the Education Committee on 18 and 23 October and 6 November (attaché level).

- 2. At the second trilogue the aim is to endorse the provisional agreement reached on Articles 1-13 (lines 85-208), with the exception of the horizontal issues (third countries, lines 105, 106, 116, 130; DiscoverEU, lines 136, 154, 176 and the duration of the programme, line 87). Sport-related issues (lines 98, 101, 128, 194.1, 198) and adult learners (lines 146, 155) as well as seal of excellence (line 121), indicators (line 122) and the European Student Card (line 156) will be discussed in the third trilogue.
- 3. The Education Committee has examined the proposed compromises and agreed to the text as set out in these Articles<sup>1</sup>. However, the compromise text in line 118 (definition of 'people with fewer opportunities') has been rephrased, based on the discussions with the legal service after the Education Committee meeting on 6 November.
- 4. Furthermore, the aim is to address the issue of governance. The European Parliament has stressed the need to ensure its right of scrutiny as a co-legislator in the design on new policy options that go beyond mere implementation of the programme. The Presidency is willing to explore options to find a solution in this regard. The Education Committee has discussed the possibility of establishing an informal stakeholder forum which could share and discuss the programme outcomes and good practices, as well as the main initiatives and new openings. Such a forum could open possibilities for a better dialogue between institutions and stakeholders; aiming at better understanding of programme activities, achievements and foreseen developments.
- 5. The <u>Permanent Representatives Committee</u> is invited to endorse a revised mandate as set out in the 4th column of the attached document (Articles 1-13) for the second informal trilogue to be held on 19 November 2019.
