Our partnership with ACCORD

Assistance and Cooperation for Community Resilience and Development, Inc. (ACCORD)

- ACCORD provides humanitarian assistance and DRR/resilience technical capacity to other partner local NGOs
- Long-term partnership focused on a "learning-by-doing" approach
- · Part of humanitarian coordination mechanisms
- Provides capacity building to local organisations on technical sectors such as shelter, WASH, Integrated Risk Management



CARE acts as a facilitator, a connector between different actors and processes









Our partnership with PKKK

Pambansang Koalisyon ng Kababaihan sa Kanayunan (PKKK); trans. "National Rural Women's Coalition"

- PKKK is a national coalition of 300 rural women organisations in 32 provinces, advancing rural women's rights in local/national advocacy (not initially a humanitarian aidcentric organisation)
- · Partners in an ECHO funded project for the first time in 2021
- They reach remote areas and ensure gender responsive localisation – due to their existing work on gender and the Women Lead in Emergencies (WLiE) Philippines pilot



CARE applied a mentoring approach to provide a response in line with the donors' approach; PKKK have reach, technical capacities, and strong structures.









How can you support more equitable partnerships?



 Hold humanitarian partners accountable for the quality and inclusivity of partnerships and collaboration with L/N partners and responders



 Ensure that in pooled funds, you hold intermediaries accountable for cascading the various quality funding provisions to frontline responders and for including L/N partners in proposal designs and in grant negotiations



 Be more flexible to include capacity strengthening and sharing components in humanitarian proposals



Support Women's Rights Organisations and Women-Led Organisations and ensure women's equal, direct, substantial participation and empowerment are integrated into mechanisms that strengthen the role of L/N actors
