Dear Secretary General,

On 11 November 2016, the Council of the European Union, based on the proposal of the European Commission, adopted a Council Implementing Decision setting out a Recommendation for temporary internal border control in exceptional circumstances putting the overall functioning of the Schengen area at risk. The Implementing Decision recommends Sweden to maintain proportionate temporary border control for a maximum period of three months, starting from the day of the adoption, at the harbours in Police Regions South and West and at the Öresund bridge.

I am writing to inform you that pursuant to Article 29 (2) of the Schengen Borders Code¹, the Swedish government decided on 11 November to apply the above mentioned Implementing Decision. Hence, border control shall be carried out on this basis from 12 November 2016 until 11 February 2017 at selected harbours in Police Regions South and West and at the Öresund bridge. The border control is carried out as a last resort since alternative measures would not achieve the same effect. The control will be limited in scope, frequency, location and time to what is strictly necessary, to respond to the serious threat and to safeguard public policy and internal security.
