## COUNCIL AND COMMISSION STATEMENT

The Council and the Commision welcome that an agreement in principle has been found on the participation of the United Kingdom in the Horizon Europe<sup>1</sup> and Copernicus<sup>2</sup> programmes from the fourth year of the multiannual financial framework (MFF) 2021-2027 onwards and support it. The Council and the Commission appreciate the mutual benefits for the research and space communities in the United Kingdom and the European Union that will derive from this participation and are looking forward to the deepening of the relationship in these areas of shared interest.

The Council and the Commission also recall that at the time of the Joint Declaration on Participation in Union Programmes and Access to Programme Services, agreed between the Union and the United Kingdom at the time of the signature and provisional application of the Trade and Cooperation Agreement (TCA) in December 2020<sup>3</sup>, a draft Protocol I was agreed in principle. In that draft Protocol it was foreseen that the United Kingdom would participate in another two measures, the EURATOM Research and Training programme<sup>4</sup> and the European Joint Undertaking for ITER<sup>5</sup>.

The Council and the Commission note with regret that the United Kingdom has decided not to participate in these two measures.

The position of the Union being expressed in this decision shall be without prejudice to any decision of the Council regarding the United Kingdom's participation in future programmes under a subsequent Multiannual Financial Framework, should the applicable EU rules allow for such a participation and the Council and the Commission will consider the United Kingdom's participation in future programmes in the light of its willingness to participate in the programmes foreseen in the Joint Declaration.
