STATEMENT 139/01

Statement by the Commission

"The Commission commits itself to replace the relevant codes (B.9 and D.41) of Article 1(3) of Regulation No. 3605/93 with new codes (EDPB9 and EDPD41) provided for by Annex V of Regulation No. 2223/96, in time for the first budgetary data reporting following the entry into force of this Regulation."

STATEMENT 140/01

Joint statement by the Council of the European Union and the European Commission

"The Council of the European Union and the European Commission underline the importance, in efforts to combat the financing of terrorism, of the Directive on prevention of the use of the financial system for the purpose of money laundering.

The Representatives of the Governments of the Member States meeting within the Council agree that any offence relating to the financing of terrorism constitutes a serious crime for the purposes of that Directive."

STATEMENT 141/01

Statement by the Commission

"The Commission reiterates the commitment made in its work programme 2001 to launch a proposal before the end of this year for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council establishing a cooperation mechanism between the competent national authorities of the Member States and the Commission in order to ensure the protection of the Communities' financial interests against illegal activities, including Value Added Tax (VAT) fraud and money laundering. This commitment has been confirmed in the Communication from the Commission concerning the Action Plan for 2001-2003 on protecting the Communities' financial interests – Fight against fraud – of 15 May 2001."

STATEMENT 142/01

Statement by the Council

"The Council considers it essential for the protection of human and animal health that a suitable monitoring programme be established, with the specific aim of gathering a set of data which can be used to revise the maximum dioxin limits.

The Council notes the Commission's intention of recommending a monitoring programme and invites Member States to place the highest priority and the greatest importance on the implementation of such programmes."

STATEMENT 143/01

Statement by the Commission

"This Directive, as an integral part of a comprehensive strategy, will reduce the presence of dioxins in feed and food in the whole European Community. One prerequisite is that the monitoring of feed materials and feedingstuffs is uniformly applied across the European Community. The Commission recommends therefore in the Recommendation accompanying this Directive that Member States should perform monitoring, proportionate to their production and use of feed materials and feedingstuffs. Furthermore, the Commission will take the necessary initiatives in the frame of the Standing Committee for Feedingstuffs to determine concrete guidelines for this monitoring. These guidelines should consist of, inter alia, the number of samples to be taken by each Member State of each main category of feed materials and feedingstuffs. The obtained data, representative for the whole European Community, will form the basis for the future revisions of the maximum levels, provided for by this Directive."

STATEMENT 144/01

Statement by the delegation of the Federal Republic of Germany

"<u>Germany</u> favours an early, sustainable reduction in the dioxin input into the food chain and particularly supports the Commission's source-related measures designed to achieve that end.

On preventive consumer health protection grounds, Germany considers that maximum dioxin and furan levels in feedingstuffs must be set lower.

Germany therefore welcomes the Council and Commission's agreement to conduct a dioxin survey, using a uniform concept, throughout the Member States in order to obtain a representative picture of background dioxin levels in the European Union. Maximum levels should be reviewed as soon as possible on the basis of the survey outcome, with the aim of reducing them."

STATEMENT 145/01

Statement by the Commission

"This Regulation, as integral part of a comprehensive strategy, will reduce the presence of dioxins in food in the whole European Community. One prerequisite is that the monitoring of foodstuffs is uniformly applied across the European Community. The Commission recommends therefore in the Recommendation accompanying this Directive that Member States should perform a monitoring, proportionate to their production and consumption of foodstuffs. Furthermore, the Commission will take the necessary initiatives in the frame of the Standing Committee for Foodstuffs to determine concrete guidelines for this monitoring. These guidelines should consist of, inter alia, the number of samples to be taken by each Member State of each main category of foodstuffs. The obtained data, representative for the whole European Community, will form the basis for the future revisions of the maximum levels, provided for by this Regulation."

STATEMENT 146/01

Statement by the Finnish and Swedish delegations

"As regards the derogation for Finland and Sweden laid down in Article 1a:

While recalling that the problem with high levels of dioxins is restricted to fatty species of fish such as Baltic herring and Baltic salmon, Finland and Sweden undertake to ensure that fish originating from the Baltic region with higher dioxin levels than those set in the now adopted regulation will not be marketed in other Member States.

Fatty species of fish such as Baltic herring and Baltic salmon will not be marketed in other Member States until monitoring and surveillance show that the limits in the regulation is not exceeded.

To this end, use will be made of the Commission regulation laying down detailed rules as regards informing consumers about fishery and aquaculture products (2065/2001). This regulation will come into force on 1 January 2002 and will require the area in which a species is caught to be specified.

Thus Regulation 2065/2001 will provide the basis to guarantee that fatty species such as Baltic herring and Baltic salmon, as well as products containing these species, will not be marketed to other Member States unless they comply with the requirements of Regulation 466/2001.

Finland and Sweden will inform the Commission and the Member States of the details concerning the measures, for example traceability, to be taken before the entering into force of the regulation amending Regulation 466/2001.

As regards third countries, Finland and Sweden will comply fully with the future requirements as drafted in the Common Position on the Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council laying down the general principles and requirements of food law, establishing the European Food Authority and laying down procedures in matters of food safety."

STATEMENT 147/01

Statement by the German delegation

"Germany abstained in the vote taken in the Council because it maintains that:

- an early, sustainable reduction in the dioxin input into the food chain is necessary; it particularly supports the Commission's source-related measures designed to achieve that end;
- the 14pg WHO-TEQ/kg body weight per week proposed as the tolerable weekly human intake for dioxins by the Scientific Committee for Food (SCF) in its opinion of 30 May 2001 should in the medium term be further reduced to under 7pg WHO-TEQ/kg body weight per week;
- with the proposed maximum levels of dioxins and furans in various foods, it will not be possible to achieve that goal or the necessary improvement in consumer health;
- the European Commission should have submitted and adopted the target levels for dioxins in foods that it announced in March 2001 before maximum levels were adopted by the Council.

Germany welcomes the Commission's intention to carry out coordinated monitoring of dioxin levels in foodstuffs throughout the Member States at an early date and asks the Commission, in the light of the findings of that monitoring exercise, promptly to adapt established maximum dioxin levels so as to improve consumer protection."

STATEMENT 148/01

Statement by the united Kingdom delegation

"The UK supports the need for action to reduce consumer exposure from dioxins in feed and food in order to protect public health. Measures to reduce emissions of dioxins to the environment are an important factor in controlling dioxins entering the food chain. The UK therefore welcomes the Communication on a strategy on dioxins recently presented by the Commission to the Council.

The UK nevertheless maintains its concern that the proposed maximum limits in the Regulation may not be proportionate to the risk. No fiche d'impact from the Commission setting out a cost-benefit analysis has been presented, and there is concern that the measure will have an impact on food supplies without a significant effect on the exposure of most consumers to dioxins in food. In addition, the limits do not yet include dioxin-like PCBs that normally contribute at least 50% of the toxicity of samples.

An effective control scheme is required to implement this proposal. The key to the effective enforcement of the limits is agreed procedures for sampling and methods of analysis. We note that a Directive addressing this area is due to be in force by July 2002. Since the coming into force date of the Regulation has also been extended to 1 July 2002 the UK is prepared to vote in favour of the proposal."

STATEMENT 149/01

Statement by the Danish delegation

"Denmark can in principle support the Commission proposal (COM(2001) 495 of 28 August 2001) for the amendment of Commission Regulation (EC) No 466/201 setting maximum levels for certain contaminants in foodstuffs.

Denmark must, however, reject the proposed exceptions to the maximum levels. Those exceptions give cause for concern as regards food safety and the operation of the internal market.

Moreover, differential treatment as between the various Baltic countries' fisheries should be avoided."
