"Deutschland unterstützt die Einigung zum finalen Kompromisstext zur Verordnung zur Schaffung eines europäischen Raums für Gesundheitsdaten und die Erteilung des Verhandlungsmandats mit dem Europäischen Parlament.

Deutschland erkennt die Notwendigkeit an, dass im Bereich der Primärnutzung von Gesundheitsdaten bestimmte persönliche elektronische Gesundheitsdaten zur Verfügung gestellt werden, auf die Patienten ebenso wie Angehörige der Gesundheits- und Pflegeberufe (im Folgenden: Leistungserbringer) zugreifen können. Deutschland hat in den letzten 20 Jahren mit der Telematikinfrastruktur eine spezielle digitale Infrastruktur zum sicheren Datenaus-tausch im deutschen Gesundheitswesen und die elektronische Patientenakte (ePA) als deren Kernanwendung aufgebaut und kontinuierlich weiterentwickelt.

Nach deutschem Verständnis ist das deutsche System der Speicherung und Verfügbarma-chung von elektronischen Gesundheitsdaten mit den in Kapitel II vorgesehen Regelungen unter Zugrundelegung der Annahme kompatibel, dass die Verfügbarkeit von Daten – unab-hängig von ihrem Speicherort – für verschiedene Akteure geregelt wird, nicht dagegen Zugrif-fe auf bestimmte Speicherorte. Wir verstehen die Formulierungen der Verordnung so, dass dieses System auch nach ihrem Inkrafttreten beibehalten werden kann:

Im Behandlungskontext speichern Leistungserbringer elektronische Gesundheitsdaten von Patienten in ihren lokalen Primärsystemen. Auf diese hat nur die jeweilige Leistungserbringerinstitution technisch Zugriff. Der zentrale Datenspeicher elektronischer Gesundheitsdaten eines Patienten ist dessen ePA. Auf diese können der Patient selbst sowie auch weitere Leistungserbringer, die ihn behandeln, technisch zugreifen.

Eine ePA wird zukünftig für jeden Patienten automatisch angelegt. Der Patient kann dies jedoch ablehnen, sich also gegen die Verfügbarmachung der Daten für andere Leistungserbringer und sich selbst entscheiden (Opt-out-Prinzip). Dann sind die Daten ausschließlich im Primärsystem des behandelnden Leistungserbringers und ausschließlich für diesen verfügbar. Die Mehrheit der im Behandlungskontext anfallenden Daten wird durch die behandelnden Leistungserbringer vom jeweiligen Primärsystem in die ePA übertragen. Der Patient kann diese Übertragung jedoch ablehnen.

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Dies kommt einer Entscheidung des Patienten gegen die Verfügbarmachung dieser Daten für andere Leistungserbringer und sich selbst gleich – mit der Folge, dass diese Daten ausschließlich für den behandelnden Leistungserbringer in des-sen Primärsystem verfügbar sind. Eine Ausnahme stellt die Übertragung genetischer Daten vom Primärsystem in die ePA dar, die nur mit Einwilligung des Patienten möglich ist.

Die Mehrheit der behandelnden Leistungserbringer hat im Behandlungskontext Zugriff auf die in der ePA gespeicherten Gesundheitsdaten. Der Patient kann Zugriffen jedoch widerspre-chen. Dies kommt einer Entscheidung des Patienten gegen die Verfügbarmachung dieser Daten für andere Leistungserbringer gleich. Eine Ausnahme stellen Zugriffe bestimmter Leistungserbringergruppen auf die ePA dar, die nur mit Einwilligung des Patienten möglich sind. Im Falle eines Widerspruchs des Patienten gegen Zugriffe auf seine ePA durch bestimmte Leistungserbringer ist auch im Notfall kein Zugriff möglich. Es ist den einzelnen Mitgliedstaaten überlassen, "emergency overrides" zu ermöglichen oder nicht.

Das Recht auf Datenportabilität wird in Deutschland bereits durch den Zugang zu den elektronischen Gesundheitsdaten eines Patienten über dessen ePA umgesetzt. Eine gesonderte Übertragung von Daten von einem Leistungserbringer an den anderen ist aufgrund der theoretischen Zugriffsmöglichkeit aller Leistungserbringer auf die ePA im deutschen Gesundheitssystem nicht erforderlich.

Aus deutscher Sicht ist es von entscheidender Bedeutung, dass das Ziel der Beibehaltung dieses komplexen und ausgewogenen deutschen Systems auch in den nun anstehenden Trilogverhandlungen Berücksichtigung findet."

"Germany supports the agreement on the final compromise text on the Regulation on the European Health Data Space and the issue of a mandate for the negotiations with the European Parliament.

Germany recognizes the need for certain personal electronic health data to be made available for patients as well as health and care professionals in the field of primary use of health data. Over the past 20 years, Germany has set up and continuously improved a special digital infrastructure for the secure exchange of data in the German healthcare system (Telematikin-frastruktur) and the electronic patient record – ePA (elektronische Patientenakte) as its core application.

In Germany's view, the German system for storing and making available electronic health data is compatible with the rules laid down in Chapter II assuming that the availability of data for various actors – regardless of the technical storage – is regulated, whereas not to the technical access to specific systems is subject to regulation by Chapter II. We understand the wording of the regulation in the sense that this system can be maintained after the regulation's entry into force.

In the context of treatment, health professionals store patients' electronic health data in their local primary systems. Technical access to these is possible only for the respective health professional's institution. The central data storage location for a patient's electronic health data is his ePA. The ePA can be technically accessed by the patient himself as well as by other healthcare professionals treating him.

An ePA will, in the future, be set up automatically for each patient. However, the patient has the right to refuse this, i.e. object to making data available to other health professionals and to himself (opt out principle). The data are then only available in the primary system of the treating health professional and only accessible for the latter.

The majority of data generated in a context of treatment is transferred from the respective primary system to the patient's ePA by the treating health professional. However, the patient has the right to refuse this transfer. This is equivalent to the patient's decision not to make these data available to other health professionals and to himself – with the result that these data are only available to the treating health professional in his primary system.

An exception is the transfer of genetic data from the primary system to the patient's ePA, which is only possible with the patient's consent.

The majority of health professionals automatically have access to health data stored in the ePA in the context of treatment. However, the patient may object to such an access. This is equivalent to the patient's decision not to make these data available to other health professionals. An exception is access by specific health professionals to a patient's ePA, which can only access a patient's ePA with the patient's consent.

If a patient objects to an access to his ePA by certain health professionals, access is also not possible in case of emergency. It is each Member State's decision whether to enable "emergency overrides" or not.

The right to data portability set is already implemented in Germany through the accessibility to a patient's electronic health data via the patient's ePA. A separate transfer of data from one health professional to another is not necessary in the German health system due to the theoretical possibility for all health professionals to access a patient's ePA.

From Germany's point of view, it is crucial that the goal of maintaining this complex and balanced German system is also taken into account in the forthcoming trialogue negotiations."







"The European Commission will work towards the timely adoption of the implementing acts establishing the decentralised IT system provided for by Regulation (EU) 2023/XXX on the digitalisation of judicial cooperation and access to justice in cross-border civil, commercial and criminal matters.

The Commission recalls that the agreement reached by the co-legislators shortens significantly the timeline for the adoption of the implementing acts. This shortening will result in overlapping Commission work on these acts and as a consequence the corresponding budget for the IT development work will need to be made available earlier (frontloaded). This revised timeline will lead to a reprogramming of the annual budget allocated to this initiative under the current Multiannual Financial Framework through reprioritisation within the existing envelope of the programmes contributing to it. As the initiative will be frontloaded in 2025 and 2026, other measures under the programmes will have to be implemented later than initially foreseen in order to keep the annual budgetary profile of the programmes unchanged. The revised timeline will also affect eu-LISA which will have to connect the new decentralised IT systems resulting from these implementing acts with the e-CODEX system. Eu-LISA will perform this task in the limit of the resources already allocated to the e-CODEX system."


