In recital 7:

*for:* ‘To take into account the possibility that the existence of exceptional circumstances might preclude the existence of a single risk, an institution should be able to present adequate evidence that two or more natural persons are not constituting a single risk, despite conditions for being considered as connected clients being met for those persons. In those cases, institutions may not identify those persons as a group of connected clients.’
