I have the honour to inform you that the Commission received a properly documented complaint requesting the initiation of an anti-dumping proceeding concerning imports of certain hot-rolled flat products of iron, non-alloy or other alloy steel originating in Turkey.

The Commission has sent to the Mission of Turkey to the European Union the enclosed Note Verbale concerning the anti-dumping proceeding mentioned above.

In accordance with Article 46 of Decision No $1 / 95$ of the EC-Turkey Association Council of 22 December 1995 on implementing the final phase of the Customs Union, I hereby inform the Customs Union Joint Committee that the Commission is examining if the initiation of the antidumping investigation concerning imports of certain hot-rolled flat products of iron, non-alloy or other alloy steel originating is warranted.

I take this opportunity to renew to the President of the EU-Turkey Association Council the assurance of my highest consideration, and to assure you that you will be kept duly informed of any further developments.

## SPECLAL NOTE VERBALE

The Directorate-General for Trade of the European Commission presents its compliments to the Mission of Turkey to the European Union and has the honour to inform it that the European Commission has received a properly documented complaint requesting the initiation of an anti-dumping proceeding concerning imports of certain hot-rolled flat products of iron, non-alloy or other alloy steel ('the product concerned') originating in Turkey.

The complaint was lodged by the European Steel Association ('Eurofer') on behalf of EU producers representing a major proportion of the EU production of the product concemed.

The product concemed is described as certain flat-rolled products of iron, non-alloy steel or other alloy steel, whether or not in coils (including 'cut-to-length' and 'narrow strip' products), not further worked than hot-rolled, not clad, plated or coated. The product concerned does not include: (i) products of stainless steel and grain oriented silicon electrical steel; (ii) products of tool steel and high-speed steel; (iii) products, not in coils, without patterns in relief, of a thickness exceeding 10 mm and of a width of 600 mm or more; and (iv) products, not in coils, without patterns in relief, of a thickness of 4.75 mm or more but not exceeding 10 mm and of a width of 2050 mm or more. It is indicated in the complaint that the product concemed falls within CN codes: 72081000,72082500 , $72082600,72082700,72083600,72083700,72083800,72083900,72084000$, $72085210,72085299,72085310,72085390,72085400,72111300,72111400$, 72111900 , ex 72251910 (TARIC code 7225191090 ), 72253090 , ex 72254060 (TARIC code 7225406090 ), 72254090 , ex 72261910 (TARIC code 7226191090 ), 72269191 and 72269199.

With regard to dumping, it is claimed by Eurofer that export prices based on the Steel Business Briefing ('SBB') of the pricing agency Platts are considerably lower than the normal value based on the same source of information. On this basis, it is alleged that a dumping margin in the range of $4-8 \%$ for exports from Turkey exists. The exporting producers identified in the complaint are listed in the attached document.

The injury caused by the allegedly dumped imports from Turkey allegedly consists of a combination of a surge in subject import volumes from Turkey at low import prices, which undercut EU producers. According to Eurofer, the pressure by imports from Turkey left EU producers no choice but to also drop their prices so as not to have plants idle and try to stay competitive, which drove the industry into losses in recent financial quarters. EU producers' production and sales also allegedly suffered and roughly 3000 workers lost their jobs in the period from 2016 to the investigation period (from 1 January 2019 to 31 January 2019).

The Commission services are currently examining this complaint and the supporting evidence submitted, in order to assess whether the initiation of an anti-dumping proceeding is warranted. This examination will be concluded within 45 days from the lodging date of the complaint.

Should the European Commission decide to initiate an anti-dumping proceeding, information, including copies of the Notice of initiation, the complaint, and a link to the questionnaires for exporting producers and other interested parties will be provided to the Mission of Turkey to the European Union immediately upon publication of the Notice of initiation of the anti-dumping proceeding in the Official Journal of the European Union.

The Directorate-General for Trade of the European Commission wishes to bring to the attention of the Mission of Turkey to the European Union that, should the proceeding be initiated, in view of the potentially large number of exporting producers in Turkey involved and in order to complete the investigation within the statutory time limits, the Commission may limit the exporting producers that will be investigated to a reasonable number by selecting a sample. In such a case, the Commission services would appreciate the cooperation of the Mission of Turkey to the European Union in the selection of a representative sample of exporting producers.

The Mission of Turkey to the European Union is urgently requested to check the list of exporting producers attached for accuracy and completeness and to provide the Commission with the names, addresses, contact persons and email addresses of any other exporting producers that may be concemed but are not listed. Please provide this information no later than by 11 May 2020 so that, should the European Commission decide to initiate an anti-dumping proceeding, the companies can be contacted without delay. The Commission appreciates the collaboration of the Mission of Turkey to the European Union in ensuring that all exporting producers have the opportunity to cooperate in the investigation.

The Directorate-General for Trade of the European Commission takes this opportunity to renew to the Mission of Turkey to the European Union the assurance of its highest consideration, and to notify that it will keep the Mission of Turkey to the European Union duly informed of any further developments.
