Subject:	Ad Hoc Working Party on One Substance One Assessment (creation and mandate)

- 1. On 7 December 2023, the <u>Commission</u> adopted three legislative proposals ("OSOA legislative proposals"):
 - Proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council establishing a common data platform on chemicals, laying down rules to ensure that the data contained in it are findable, accessible, interoperable and reusable and establishing a monitoring and outlook framework for chemicals¹;
 - Proposal for a Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council amending
 Directive 2011/65/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards the reattribution of scientific and technical tasks to the European Chemicals Agency²;

- Proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Regulations (EC) No 178/2002, (EC) No 401/2009, (EU) 2017/745 and (EU) 2019/1021 of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards the re-attribution of scientific and technical tasks and improving cooperation among Union agencies in the area of chemicals³.
- 2. These proposed legislative acts aim to apply the "one substance, one assessment" approach announced in the Chemicals Strategy for Sustainability⁴ and thus strengthen the efficiency, effectiveness, consistency and transparency of chemical safety assessments across EU legislation.
- 3. In order to effectively address the cross-sectoral matters covered by the OSOA legislative proposals and to carry out the preparatory work linked to their examination within the Council, the Presidency proposes to establish, in accordance with Article 19(3) of the Council's Rules of Procedure⁵, an Ad Hoc Working Party (AHWP) on the implementation of the "one substance, one assessment" approach in the context of chemical safety assessments ("AHWP OSOA") in order to involve experts from the different sectors concerned (environment, agriculture, health, trade, etc.).
- 4. Under the authority of the Permanent Representatives Committee, the AHWP OSOA will report to the "Environment" configuration of the Council as well as, where appropriate, to the "Agriculture and fishing" configuration of the Council, the "Employment, social policy, health and consumers" configuration of the Council, and the "Competitiveness" configuration of the Council.

- 5. The AHWP OSOA will operate in accordance with the mandate set out in the Annex to this note and will draw on the expertise of delegates working in the relevant areas, where appropriate. It will cease to exist upon the adoption of final legislative acts based on the proposed OSOA legislative acts or upon decision of the Permanent Representatives Committee. The mandate of the AHWP OSOA may be updated or revised, including its possible extension, in order to carry out the necessary legislative or non-legislative preparatory work related to the proposed OSOA legislative acts.
- 6. The AHWP OSOA will carry out its tasks in close coordination and avoiding duplication with other preparatory bodies of the Council.
- 7. In this context, the Permanent Representatives Committee is invited to approve:
 - the establishment of an Ad Hoc Working Party (AHWP) on the implementation of the "one substance, one assessment" approach in the context of chemical safety assessments ("AHWP OSOA");
 - the mandate, as set out in the <u>Annex</u> to this note.
