Subject: Financing of the European Child Guarantee Scheme for the 2021-2027 period

Yesterday, the Finnish Presidency presented a negotiating package on the Multiannual Financial Framework for the 2021-2027 period. It significantly reduces funding for the European Social Fund Plus (ESF+). The negotiating document contained no references to the European Child Guarantee Scheme, to which Parliament is proposing to allocate EUR 5.9 billion over a seven-year period.

A European Child Guarantee Scheme is essential to combat persistent child poverty in the European Union. At present, around 20 million children are in poverty in the EU, which is unjustifiable. We must therefore ensure that we have the resources to tackle child poverty over the next seven years.

I would like to know whether the Council intends to provide funding for the European Child Guarantee Scheme and what amount is being proposed?
