In the reporting period (1 - 31 January 2007) the number of refused aliens went up by 2.5% compared to the same month in 2006. This was mainly due to two reasons:

- introduction of visa requirements to the nationals of Bulgaria's neighbouring states upon accession of Bulgaria to the EU
- discontinuation of the issuance of state tax stamps at border checkpoints to Turkish nationals

- introduction of visa requirements to the nationals of neighbouring states upon accession of Bulgaria to the EU
- discontinuation of the issuance of state tax stamps at border checkpoints to Turkish nationals

As compared to January 2007, there is a reduction by 45% in the number of refused nationals.

From January 2007 the Federal Police data systems were adapted to allow for the separate States of Serbia and Montenegro; however, a clear separation in the entry statistics is not possible, since most persons concerned still have old, valid travel documents and use them to prove their identity.

Only with regard to asylum applications on German territory as a whole was an increase of almost 10 % on the previous month observed. Serbian applicants largely contributed to this increase.

There was a noticeable increase in Russian nationals, in the case of both refusals and illegal entry (especially at airports). Chinese nationals also continued to figure significantly, with an upward trend.

As regards illegal immigration by sea, in February 2007 a total of 20 vessels, with 500 people on board, reached the shores of southern Spain and the Canary Islands. That represents a decrease of 52,38 % in the number of vessels and of 53,61 % in the number of people, compared with the January figures, which amounted to 42 vessels and 1 078 people. In comparison with February 2006, for which the figure was 1 550, the figure of 500 for February 2007 represents a decrease of 67,74 %. That is the result of the measures which Spain is adopting, in cooperation with the other Member States and under Frontex coordination, in the countries of origin and of better collaboration with those countries.

The top nationalities were Gambia (GMB), Morocco (MAR), Côte d'Ivoire (CIV) and Mali (MLI).

The Canary Islands have become the main point of arrival for such vessels.

With regard to the fight against organised crime networks involved in facilitating illegal immigration, two of the mafias dismantled were as follows:

- 1) In February the mafias controlling Chinese prostitution in Madrid were dismantled. 14 people were arrested including the heads of the six organisations operating in the Spanish capital.  
To recruit women, these organisations put advertisements in newspapers in Chinese on sale in the Comunidad de Madrid.  
Although the women working as prostitutes were not minors, the organisations took advantage of their childlike appearance and played it up in the decoration of the rooms they worked in, adding dolls and soft toys.
- 2) At the beginning of March another criminal organisation of Pakistani origin was dismantled; it was involved in arranging marriages between immigrants from India and Pakistan and citizens of the European Union, the object being to regularise their situation by obtaining papers as a family member of a European Union citizen, and also in organising "pretend marriages" that were never carried out but on the basis of which family record books were falsified.  
Contacts were established through a marriage bureau and the clients were recruited in phone shops run by Pakistanis, charging between EUR 5 000 and 12 000.  
Moreover, a large haul of documentation was seized: falsified Spanish family record books, national identity cards for Spanish women, photocopies of marriage certificates, death certificates and registration certificates for Indian and Pakistani citizens.

The vessel was carrying a total of 369 illegal immigrants, of whom 35 came from sub-Saharan countries and 334 were Asian.

The 35 Africans comprised: 11 immigrants from Guinea Conakry, 10 from Sierra Leone, 11 from Côte d'Ivoire and 3 from Liberia.

Of the 334 Asian immigrants, 144 were identified as Indian and 74 as Pakistani.

All the Africans were transported to Guinea Conakry and 133 people were returned to India. Work on identifying and repatriating the rest of the illegal immigrants is still in progress.

1.6. Comments

Summarizing results of January 2007 in comparison with the previous month the number of refusals of entry in the Republic of Latvia has decreased. At the border crossing points 106 foreigners were refused to enter Latvia who could not present the valid visa of the Republic of Latvia. All together the number of refusals of entry has decreased by 4,86% and increased by 128,33 % compared to January 2006. The highest number of refusals relates to citizens of Russia, Belarus, Kazakhstan and Ukraine, Most refusals were carried out at the land borders of Russia and Belarus.

Concerning apprehended aliens inside the country there has been a decrease by 5,00% in comparison with the previous month (December – 20 persons: January – 19 persons) and increased by 35,71 % compared to January 2006. 1.6. Comments

Summarizing results of February 2007 in comparison with the previous month the number of refusals of entry into the Republic of Latvia has decreased. From all persons who were refused at the border crossing points 68 foreigners were refused to enter Latvia because they could not present the valid visa of the Republic of Latvia. Altogether the number of refusals of entry has decreased by 28,47 % and increased by 151, 28 % compared to February 2006. The highest number of refusals relates to citizens of Russia, Belarus, Ukraine and Kazakhstan. Most refusals were carried out at the land borders of Russia and Belarus. Concerning apprehended aliens inside the country there has been a decrease by 31,58 % in comparison with the previous month (January – 19 persons: February – 13 persons) and a decrease by 55,17 % compared to February 2006. Expulsions in comparison with the previous month had decreased by 13,33 % (January -15 persons, February – 13 persons) and increased by 30 % compared to February 2006.

In February on the border crossing points a number of detected false passports decreased by 30 % (January – 10, February- 7).
