The <u>Italian delegation</u> raised the point at the start of the Council and stressed that the measures taken were insufficient in its view. All meetings should be held via videoconferencing. The <u>Secretary-General</u> recalled the decision taken by the President of the European Council, the President of the European Commission and the Presidency of the Council based on upholding the capacity of the union to take decisions, to limit the spread of disease while adapting the work of the institutions. The Secretary-General listed the measures taken in the Council and took good note of the comments.
