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Subject: Legislative programming  
- Joint Declaration on the EU legislative priorities for 2025  
- Joint Conclusions on Policy Objectives and Priorities for 2025-2029  
= *Approval*

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1. In 2016, the European Parliament, the Council and the Commission agreed to reinforce the Union's annual and multiannual programming through the interinstitutional agreement on better law-making<sup>1</sup> (IIA-BLM paragraphs 4-11). Also in 2016, the Council approved its practical arrangements on annual programming<sup>2</sup>.
2. With regard to multiannual programming, it is foreseen that upon the appointment of a new Commission, in order to facilitate longer-term planning, the three Institutions will exchange views on the principal policy objectives and priorities for the new term. They will, on the Commission's initiative and as appropriate, draw up joint conclusions to be signed by the Presidents of the three Institutions.

3. With regard to annual programming, the Commission should engage in a dialogue with the European Parliament and the Council, both before and after the adoption of its annual work programme. Following the adoption of the Commission work programme and drawing on it, the three Institutions will exchange views on initiatives for the coming year and agree on a joint declaration on annual programming, to be signed by the Presidents of the three Institutions.
4. At its meeting on 17 December 2024, the Council (General Affairs) held an exchange of views on programming with the Commission. A summary of the exchange of views and of the written comments received after the meeting was reflected in a letter<sup>3</sup> by the President of the Council to the President of the Commission.
5. The Commission adopted its work programme for 2025 on 11 February 2025<sup>4</sup> and presented it to the Council (General Affairs) on 25 February 2025, followed by an exchange of views on programming, which provided a basis for the following interinstitutional negotiations.
6. Subsequently, the Presidency, accompanied by the incoming Presidency, negotiated the draft Joint Declaration and Joint Conclusions with the European Parliament and the Commission on the basis of texts put forward by the Commission.
7. The Permanent Representatives Committee discussed the draft texts on 12 March 2025 and agreed on the draft Joint Declaration<sup>5</sup> and Joint Conclusions<sup>6</sup> on 14 March 2025.
8. The Council is therefore invited to approve the texts of the Joint Declaration and Joint Conclusions respectively set out in documents 6808/25 and 6809/25 at its meeting on 18 March 2025.
9. The statement by Hungary for the minutes of the Council is set out in the Addendum 1 to this document.
