Subject:	Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) .../... of 11.2.2025 amending Delegated Regulation (EU) 2019/1122 supplementing Directive 2003/87/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards the functioning of the Union Registry – Decision to request an extension of the time-limit

1. The Commission submitted the abovementioned Delegated Regulation<sup>1</sup> to the Council on 11 February 2025 in accordance with the procedure set out in Article 290 TFEU and with Articles 19(3) and 23 of Directive 2003/87/EC<sup>2</sup>.
2. In accordance with Article 23(6) of Directive 2003/87/EC, the Council may object to the delegated act within a period of two months from its notification by the Commission on 11 February 2025, i.e., until 14 April 2025. The period for expressing an objection can be extended by two months.

3. During the written consultation of the Working Party on the Environment, which expired on 7 March 2025, two delegations requested an extension of the period for raising objections.
  4. The Working Party on the Environment examined the delegated act at its meeting on 14 March 2025, where a majority of delegations expressed support for requesting an extension of the period for raising objections.
  5. It is therefore suggested that the Permanent Representatives Committee recommend that the Council decide to extend the period for raising objections by two months, i.e. until 16 June 2025, in accordance with Article 23(6) of Directive 2003/87/EC.
  6. The Commission and the European Parliament are to be informed accordingly.
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
