Subject: Prolongation of border controls at the Icelandic internal borders

In order to combat the spread of the Covid-19 virus, Icelandic authorities reintroduced internal border controls at all borders for 10 days on the 18 March.

For Icelandic authorities to continue to be able to enforce existing regulation for travelers to Iceland and to combat further spread of the virus, it is deemed necessary to prolong border controls at all internal borders in Iceland (air and sea borders). The prolongation is unavoidable at this time, based on a risk assessment by the National Commissioner of the Icelandic Police. Therefore, pursuant to Art. 28. of Regulation 2016/399 on the rules governing the movements of persons across borders (Schengen Borders Code), Iceland kindly informs the Commission that it will prolong border controls for a period of 20 days on March 28. A decision on any further prolongation is expected to be taken later.
