**Decision on the implementation of a legal act.**

Dear Ms Roger,

The European Parliament and the Council have adopted the following legal act under the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, and in particular Article 77(2), points (a) and (b) thereof:

- **DECISION (EU) 2022/2512 OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND OF THE COUNCIL of 14 December 2022 on the non-acceptance of travel documents of the Russian Federation issued in Ukraine and Georgia**

In accordance with Articles 1 and 2 of Protocol (No 22) on the position of Denmark, annexed to the Treaty on European Union (TEU) and the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union (TFEU), Denmark does not take part in the adoption by the Council of measures proposed pursuant to Title V of Part Three of the TFEU.

Denmark therefore did not take part in the Council's adoption of the above legal act, which is not binding upon or applicable in Denmark (see Article 2 of the Protocol).

The act constitutes a development of the Schengen acquis. In accordance with Article 4 of Protocol (No 22) on the position of Denmark, Denmark has to decide, within a period of six months after the Council has decided on a proposal to build upon the Schengen acquis, whether it will implement the legal act in its national law. If Denmark decides to do so, that decision will create an obligation under international law between Denmark and the other Member States bound by the measure.

On that basis, Denmark hereby gives notice that it has decided to implement the above legal act in Danish law, under Article 4 of Protocol (No 22) on the position of Denmark.
