	- Confirmation of the final compromise text with a view to agreement

## I. Introduction

- 1. On 29 November 2019, the <u>Commission</u> submitted to the European Parliament and to the Council the above-mentioned proposal<sup>1</sup>, aiming at implementing into EU law the ICCAT multiannual management plan for Bluefin tuna in the eastern Atlantic and Mediterranean, adopted in 2018<sup>2</sup>.
- 2. The <u>Working Party on Fisheries Policy</u> examined the proposal and the set of amendments tabled by the European Parliament on several occasions.

In November 2019, ICCAT adopted Recommendation 19-04 amending Recommendation 18-02.

- 3. With a revised mandate for negotiations<sup>3</sup> agreed by the <u>Permanent Representatives Committee</u> on 4 November 2020, the Presidency reached a provisional agreement with the European Parliament at a political trilogue on 10 November 2020.
- 4. On 25 November 2020, the final compromise text<sup>4</sup> reflecting the outcome of that trilogue was presented to the <u>Permanent Representatives Committee</u>. The <u>Permanent Representatives</u>

  Committee did not agree to this final compromise text.
- 5. The <u>European Parliament</u> adopted its first reading position on 28 April 2021<sup>5</sup>. The text adopted at first reading is the same text as the final compromise of the political trilogue<sup>6</sup>.
- 6. On 16 June 2021, the <u>Permanent Representatives Committee</u> agreed to the revised mandate for negotiations with the European Parliament as set out in document 9167/21 PECHE 166 CODEC 773 with a view to an early second reading agreement with the European Parliament.
- 7. Informal meetings resumed during the <u>Swedish Presidency</u> in January and February 2023 involving experts from the Presidency, the European Parliament and the European Commission.
- 8. On 1 March 2023, the <u>European Parliament's Committee on Fisheries</u> voted to continue the interinstitutional negotiations.
- 9. An interinstitutional technical meeting followed on 22 March 2023 at which the three institutions reached a preliminary agreement on the text to be proposed for final agreement.
- 10. On 30 March 2023, the Working Party on Fisheries Policy endorsed the revised Presidency compromise, as contained in ST 7820/23 + COR1. This Presidency compromise was based on the text agreed at technical level in the interinstitutional technical meeting on 22 March 2023.
- 11. The Presidency compromise in ST 7820/23 + COR1 was prepared on the basis of ST 8143/21 (Outcome of European Parliament first reading), which has undergone lawyer linguist revision at the European Parliament. The textual changes proposed on substance in the current

Presidency compromise<sup>7</sup> as compared to the previous Council mandate<sup>8</sup> are only in Art. 7 (old Art. 7), Art. 11.2 (old 10.2), Art. 12 (old Art. 11), Art. 47 (old Art. 46), Art 51.4 (old Art. 50.4) and Art. 51.9 (old Art. 50.9).

## II. Conclusion

- 12. In light of the above, the <u>Permanent Representatives Committee</u> is invited to confirm the final compromise text as set out in ST 7820/23 + COR1 with a view to agreement in early second reading with the European Parliament.
- 13. The European Parliament's Committee on Fisheries (PECHE) is expected to vote on 26-27 April 2023, following which the PECHE Chair will transmit a letter to the Presidency confirming that, should the Council approve this text in first reading, after legal-linguistic revision, the Parliament would approve the Council's position in its second reading.
