Subject:	Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) .../... of 23.2.2023 amending Delegated Regulation (EU) 2019/907 as regards the certificates of competency and the professional qualifications in certain Member States - Intention not to raise objection to a delegated act

1. On 23 February 2023, the Commission submitted the above draft Delegated Regulation to the Council, in accordance with its Article 49b and 49b (4) of Directive (EC) 36/2005¹, in order to change the current analogue sticker system for the holder of a particular professional qualification by replacing it with an entry into the Internal Market Information System (IMI)² by the responsible entities. IMI is already in use in the Member States, and it has been deemed necessary to update the legal regime in order to reflect this administrative practice.

2. The common training test (CTT) facilitated by the present delegated act is a standardised aptitude test available across participating Member States and reserved to holders of a particular professional qualification. Passing successfully such a test in a Member State shall entitle the holders of a particular professional, ski instructors, in this case, to pursue the profession in any host Member State concerned under the same conditions as the holders of a professional qualification acquired in the host Member State. The competent entities responsible for the CTT will generate a unique ID in the IMI system to serve as proof. With this ID, the ski instructors can benefit from automatic recognition of their professional qualifications in all Member States.
 3. On 24 February 2023, delegations were asked to indicate their possible opposition to the above draft Delegated Regulation by 24 March 2023. No delegation raised any grounds for opposition. The official two-month deadline expires on 24 April 2023.
 4. There will be no Council before the final expiring date of the above delegated act in order for this act to be formally approved as Council item without discussion. The present Information Note ST 7833/23 is issued, therefore, to inform Member States of the intention of the Council not to raise objections to this delegated act.
