

Statement by the Commission

"Pursuant to Article 193 TFEU, Member States are allowed to maintain or introduce more stringent measures to protect the environment than those already in place, as long as they are compatible with the Treaties and are notified to the Commission. In turn, the Commission verifies the compatibility of the said measures with EU law. As regards the amendment of the Habitats Directive consisting in moving the wolf from Annex IV to Annex V of the Directive, national authorities need to notify the Commission of the corresponding transposition measures within 18 months from publication of the amending directive in the Official Journal of the European Union. In case Member States intend to maintain a higher protection level of the wolf at national level, this should be signaled at the time of the notification of their transposition measures to the Commission. This does not require adopting any specific legal instrument."

Statement by Portugal

"Em Portugal, os resultados obtidos no Censo 2019-2021 apontam para que tenha ocorrido uma contração da área de presença de lobo nas duas últimas décadas, nomeadamente na região de Trás-os-Montes e a sul do rio Douro, na zona envolvente ao vale desse rio.

O número de alcateias detetadas sofreu também uma ligeira redução a nível nacional, apresentando tendências muito diferentes nos quatro núcleos populacionais existentes.

Entre os principais fatores que estarão a comprometer a conservação do lobo em Portugal, encontra-se a mortalidade causada diretamente por humanos, que continua, em muitas áreas, a ser responsável pelo desaparecimento da espécie e/ou de alcateias.

Apesar das medidas de conservação em curso, nomeadamente de melhoria do mecanismo de indemnização por prejuízos atribuídos ao lobo, e da promoção de uma melhor proteção dos efetivos pecuários, através do apoio técnico e financeiro aos criadores de gado, para implementarem as medidas mais adequadas a cada contexto, o estado de conservação da espécie permanece desfavorável.

Portugal não se opôs à proposta de Decisão do Conselho para a apresentação, pela União Europeia, de uma proposta para alteração dos Anexos II e III da Convenção de Berna, em solidariedade com as necessidades específicas de Estados-Membros que vivem realidades diferentes da portuguesa, quanto ao estado de conservação do lobo, poderem rever esse estatuto à luz das suas necessidades concretas.

No momento da adoção da proposta de Decisão (datada de 24 de setembro), Portugal apresentou uma Declaração de voto deixando claro que manterá a atual política de conservação do lobo no nosso território, com vista a garantir que esta espécie alcance um estado de conservação favorável e de acordo com o compromisso assumido relativamente ao objetivo de conservação estabelecido pela Diretiva Habitats.

Portugal reitera os termos da Declaração de 24 de setembro de 2024, e afirma que, apesar das alterações verificadas nos Anexos da Convenção de Berna e da presente proposta de alteração à Diretiva 92/43/CEE, pretende manter, no seu território nacional, o atual estatuto de proteção rigorosa do lobo-ibérico, ao abrigo da faculdade prevista no artigo 193.º do TFUE, nos termos do qual os Estados-Membros estão autorizados a manter ou introduzir medidas de proteção reforçadas, compatíveis com os Tratados e notificadas à Comissão.

Assim, para esse efeito e, tendo também em conta o disposto no Considerando (6) da presente proposta de alteração à Diretiva 92/43/CEE, Portugal irá notificar a Comissão Europeia, dentro do prazo para a transposição da Diretiva, da sua decisão de manter, ao abrigo da referida faculdade, o atual estatuto de proteção rigorosa do lobo-ibérico no seu território nacional."

"In Portugal, the results obtained in the 2019-2021 Census indicate that there has been a contraction in the area of wolf presence in the last two decades, namely in the Trás-os-Montes region and south of the Douro River, in the area around the valley of that river.

The number of packs detected also suffered a slight reduction at a national level, showing very different trends in the four existing population centers.

Among the main factors that would be compromising the conservation of the wolf in Portugal is mortality caused directly by humans, which continues, in many areas, to be responsible for the disappearance of the species and/or packs.

Despite ongoing conservation measures, such as improving the compensation mechanism for damages attributed to wolves, and promoting better protection of livestock herds, through technical and financial support for livestock farmers, to implement the most appropriate measures for each context, the conservation status of the species remains unfavorable.

Portugal did not oppose the proposal for a Council Decision for the presentation, by the European Union, of a proposal to amend Annexes II and III of the Bern Convention, in solidarity with the specific needs of Member States that live in different realities to Portugal, regarding the conservation status of the wolf, to be able to review this status in light of their specific needs.

At the time of the adoption of the proposed Decision (dated 24 September), Portugal presented a Declaration of Vote making it clear that it will maintain the current wolf conservation policy in our territory, with a view to ensuring that this species reaches a favourable conservation status and in line with the commitment made in relation to the conservation objective established by the Habitats Directive.

Portugal reiterates the terms of the Declaration of 24 September 2024, and states that, despite the changes made to the Annexes to the Bern Convention and the present proposal to amend Directive 92/43/EEC, it intends to maintain, in its national territory, the current status of strict protection of the Iberian wolf, by applying the option provided for in Article 193 of the TFEU, under which Member States are authorised to maintain or introduce more stringent protective measures, compatible with the Treaties and notified to the Commission. Therefore, to this end and also taking into account the provisions of Recital (6) of this proposal to amend Directive 92/43/EEC, Portugal will notify the European Commission, within the deadline for transposition of the Directive, of its decision to maintain, under the aforementioned option, the current strict protection status of the Iberian wolf in its national territory."
