Notification regarding Council Decision (EU) 2020/132

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, and in particular Article 77(2)(b) and (c) and Article 292, first and second sentence, thereof, the Council has adopted the following non-binding legal act:

- COUNCIL RECOMMENDATION (EU) 2021/132 of 2 February 2021 amending Recommendation (EU) 2020/912 on the temporary restriction on non-essential travel into the EU and the possible lifting of such restriction

In accordance with Article 1 of Protocol (No 22) on the position of Denmark, annexed to the Treaty on European Union and the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union (hereinafter: 'TFEU'), Denmark does not take part in the adoption by the Council of proposed measures pursuant to Title V of Part Three TFEU. Denmark therefore did not take part in the adoption of the Recommendation, which is not applicable in Denmark (see Article 2 of the Protocol).

However, the measure constitutes a development of the Schengen acquis, although it is of a non-binding nature.

In accordance with Article 4 of the Protocol, Denmark has to decide, within a period of six months after the Council has decided on a proposal to build upon the Schengen acquis under the provisions of Title V of Part Three TFEU, whether it will implement this measure. As it is not a binding measure, Denmark's implementation of the Recommendation will not lead to an obligation under international law for Denmark. The Recommendation will thus have the same status for Denmark as it has for the other Member States.

On that basis, Denmark hereby gives notice that it has decided to implement the above measure in accordance with Article 4 of the Protocol.
