Based on the Declaration of Intent on Cooperation within the Framework of the  
«LUBLIN TRIANGLE» signed online on the 28<sup>th</sup> of February 2022,

The Ministry of Culture of the Republic of Lithuania, the Ministry of Culture and  
National Heritage of the Republic of Poland and the Ministry of Culture and  
Information Policy of Ukraine

**Discussed** the concrete steps to be made in order to support Ukraine and to  
counteract the Russian aggression against Ukrainian cultural and information spheres;

**Confirmed** mutual strong intention to continue imposing sanctions against the Russian  
Federation and promote the sanctions policy within the EU;

**Confirmed** intention to provide support to Ukrainian information sphere, including the  
broadcasting of the Ukrainian TV channels in Ukraine and the EU;

**Confirmed** intention to provide support to Ukrainian artists and cultural professionals  
as a visible act of solidarity – both in Ukraine and abroad;

**Confirmed** joint commitment to safeguard and restore the Ukrainian cultural heritage  
suffering from the military aggression of the Russian Federation.
