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1. **Adoption of the agenda** 8961/25

Non-discussion items (I)

2. **Summary record of the 1743rd meeting of the SCA** 8492/25

The SCA approved the summary record.

3. **Regulation amending the POSEI Regulation for outermost regions affected by natural disasters, in particular cyclone Chido devastating Mayotte**  8224/25
Confirmation of the final text with a view to agreement

The SCA noted the existence of a qualified majority to approve the text as set out in document 8224/25.

The SCA therefore authorised the Presidency to send a letter to the European Parliament informing it that a first reading agreement could be reached on the Commission's proposal, provided that Parliament agreed to adopt its position in the form of that text.

4. **Draft delegated regulation amending Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2023/370 of 13 December 2022 supplementing Regulation (EU) 2021/2115 of the European Parliament and of the Council with regard to procedures, time limits for submission by Member States of requests for amendments of CAP Strategic Plans, and further cases for which the maximum number of amendments of CAP Strategic Plans does not apply** 8820/25
Intention not to raise objections

The SCA agreed to invite the Council to confirm, as an "A" item at its session on 26 May 2025, that it had no intention to object to the delegated act.

5. **Regulation amending the common market organisation (CMO) Regulation as regards the strengthening of the position of farmers in the food supply chain**  8769/1/25 REV 1
Mandate for negotiations with the European Parliament

The SCA discussed the targeted proposal to amend the CMO Regulation based on the Presidency's updated compromise suggestions and gave the Presidency a mandate for negotiations with the European Parliament on that basis.

The SCA took note of delegations' and the Commission's comments, in particular the annexed statement by Slovenia.

6. **Amending Regulation as regards certain market rules and sectoral support measures in the wine sector and for aromatised wine products**  8771/25
Guidance for further work

The SCA discussed the proposal on the Amending Regulation as regards certain market rules and sectoral support measures in the wine sector and for aromatised wine products and provided guidance for further work. The SCA took note of delegations' and the Commission's comments.

10. Organisation of future work

The Presidency informed the SCA about the next SCA meeting on 2 June 2025 and the "Agriculture and Fisheries" Council meeting on 26 May 2025. Regarding that Council meeting,

- Italy and Greece requested a public item under “any other business” on “Separate funds between fisheries and agriculture policy”;
- Latvia requested a public item under “any other business”, on the meeting of the three Ministers of Agriculture of the Baltic states which took place in Riga on 11 April 2025;
- The Commission requested a public item under “any other business” on the AU-EU Agriculture Ministerial Conference, which will take place on 25 June 2025 in Rome;
- The SCA agreed that the three AOB items above would be taken in public session in accordance with Article 8(2) of the rules of procedure of the Council.
- Luxembourg informed the SCA about an item under “any other business”, requested at Coreper, on “Simplification of the EUDR: difficulties in implementing the EUDR and the need for substantial simplification”.

Ad item 5: **Regulation amending the common market organisation (CMO)**
 Regulation as regards the strengthening of the position of farmers in
 the food supply chain

STATEMENT BY SLOVENIA

“Slovenia welcomes and supports the proposal to amend the CMO Regulation, as it represents a significant step towards strengthening the bargaining power of farmers and improving their position within the food supply chain.

However, we regret that the possibility of derogating from competition rules for non-recognised producer organisations and cooperatives has been excluded from the new draft of the Regulation.

For Slovenia, it is of key importance to address the legal status of cooperatives, which, in practice, already operate in a manner comparable to recognised producer organisations. Including the option for exemption would help clarify their position and enhance legal certainty in this regard.”
