#### 'A' ITEM NOTE

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Subject: Delegated regulation amending Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2023/370 of 13 December 2022 supplementing Regulation (EU) 2021/2115 of the European Parliament and of the Council with regard to procedures, time limits for submission by Member States of requests for amendments of CAP Strategic Plans, and further cases for which the maximum number of amendments of CAP Strategic Plans does not apply  
*- Intention not to raise objections*

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1. The Commission submitted the above-mentioned delegated act (doc. 9093/25) to the Council in accordance with the procedure set out in Article 290 TFEU and with Article 122 of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 2 December 2021. As the Commission notified the delegated act on 21 May 2025, the Council may object to it until 21 July 2025.
2. The delegated act provides Member States with more time to plan possible transfers of financial allocations between direct payments and the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development (EAFRD), and between direct payments and other sectors, as it postpones the deadline for these transfers from 31 May to 31 July. For these changes to take effect, the delegated act must enter into force by 31 May 2025.

3. The Special Committee on Agriculture (SCA) on 19 May 2025 took note that the delegated act was still in preparation and agreed that an informal consultation should be launched on 21 May 2025 to verify whether delegations consider that there are no grounds for the Council to object to the delegated act.
4. Following the outcome of the informal consultation, the Council should decide:
  - (a) in accordance with article 19(2) of the Council Rules of Procedure, to proceed without prior preparation; and
  - (b) to confirm that it has no intention to object to the delegated act and that the Commission and the European Parliament be informed thereof.

This implies that, unless the European Parliament objects to it, the delegated act shall be published and enter into force in accordance with Article 152(6) of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115.
