THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, and in particular **Articles 103 and 352, in conjunction with** Article 218(3) and (4) thereof,

Having regard to the recommendation from the European Commission,

Whereas:

Atomic Energy Community, of the one part, and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, of the other part (the 'Trade and Cooperation Agreement') was concluded by the Union by means of Council Decision (EU) 2021/6895 and entered into force on 1 May 2021, having been provisionally applied since 1 January 2021

On 29 December 2020, the Council adopted Decision (EU) 2020/2252<sup>1</sup> on the signing, on behalf of the Union, and on provisional application of the Trade and Cooperation Agreement between the European Union and the European Atomic Energy Community, of the one part, and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, of the other part (the 'Trade and Cooperation Agreement') and of the Agreement between the European Union and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland concerning security procedures for exchanging and protecting classified information (the 'Security

Council Decision (EU) 2020/2252 of 29 December 2020 on the signing, on behalf of the Union, and on provisional application of the Trade and Cooperation Agreement between the European Union and the European Atomic Energy Community, of the one part, and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, of the other part, and of the Agreement between the European Union and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland concerning security procedures for exchanging and protecting classified information (OJ L 444, 31.12.2020, p. 2).

of Information Agreement'). The Trade and Cooperation Agreement and the Security of Information Agreement were signed on 30 December 2020, subject to their conclusion at a later date.

- (2) On 29 April 2021, the Council adopted Council Decision 2021/689<sup>2</sup> on the conclusion, on behalf of the Union, of the Trade and Cooperation Agreement and the Security of Information Agreement ('the Agreements'). The Agreements entered into force on 1 May 2021.
- (3) Following the withdrawal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland from the European Union, the cooperation and information exchange possibilities with the UK competition authority in the context of the European Competition Network (ECN), where the European Commission and the national competition authorities of the Member States (NCAs) closely cooperate with each other, no longer exist.
- (4) The Trade and Cooperation Agreement does not create such close cooperation and only allows for cooperation in the field of competition that is permitted under domestic rules. Article 361, paragraph 4 of the Trade and Cooperation Agreement acknowledges, however, the possibility for an agreement between the Parties on cooperation and coordination between the European Commission, the competition authorities of the Member States and the United Kingdom's competition authority or authorities, which agreement may include conditions for the exchange and use of confidential information.

<u>Agreement</u>, with the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland on cooperation and exchange of information in competition matters,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

The Commission is hereby authorised to negotiate, on behalf of the Union, with the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, open negotiations for a supplementing agreement within the meaning of Article 2 of the Trade and Cooperation Agreement an agreement on cooperation and exchange of information in competition matters.

Article 2

The Commission is hereby nominated as the Union negotiator.

Article 2

The negotiating directives are set out in the annex to this decision.

Article 3

The negotiations shall be conducted in consultation with the [name of the special committee to be inserted by the Council]. Working Party on the United Kingdom and in accordance with the directives contained in the addendum, subject to any directives which the Council may subsequently issue to the Commission.

Article 4

This Decision is addressed to the Commission.
