Subject:	Intention to negotiate Non-Binding Instrument ('NBI') in the form of a Memorandum of Understanding on Enhanced Cooperation between the European Union and the Government of the Faroe Islands - Authorisation to negotiate a Non-Binding Instrument (NBI)

1. On 17 May 2023, the European External Action Service (EEAS) presented to the Council an information note regarding its intention to negotiate a Non-Binding Instrument ('NBI') in the form of a Memorandum of Understanding on Enhanced Cooperation between the European Union and the Government of the Faroe Islands¹.
2. Discussions on options to strengthen EU-Faroe Islands cooperation have been ongoing. In July 2021, the Faroese government proposed to negotiate a "Partnership Declaration". In its Conclusions of 21 June 2022, the Council assessed the state of EU relations with the Faroe Islands noting that the Faroe Islands are an important partner of the EU with regard to several of the EU policies.

3. In accordance with the Arrangements for Non-binding Instruments agreed by the Council, the Commission and the EEAS in December 2017, the Memorandum of Understanding on Enhanced Cooperation between the European Union and the Government of the Faroe Islands would demonstrate the political commitment of both sides and is to be considered as a non legally binding instrument, entailing no financial commitments ².
4. On 23 May 2023, the European Free Trade Agreement working party examined and agreed on the note regarding EEAS' intention to negotiate, in close consultation with the Commission services, a NBI in the form of a Memorandum of Understanding on Enhanced Cooperation between the European Union and the Government of the Faroe Islands, as set out in document 9816/23. The Memorandum of Understanding would, within the Parties' fields of competences, refer to existing areas of cooperation (including, but not limited to fisheries, trade, research/scientific cooperation) and add other areas of relevance for the bilateral EU-Faroes relationship (e.g. climate change, arctic matters, energy, environment, marine biodiversity, twin transition, food security taxation/tax good governance and education, culture, youth). The Memorandum of Understanding would also include provisions on regular consultations, aimed at taking stock of the overall state of play of the cooperation would be organised.
5. Consequently, the Committee of Permanent Representatives is invited to approve the intention to negotiate a NBI in the form of a Memorandum of Understanding on Enhanced Cooperation between the European Union and the Government of the Faroe Islands, and to forward the latter to the Council for approval at one of its upcoming meetings.
