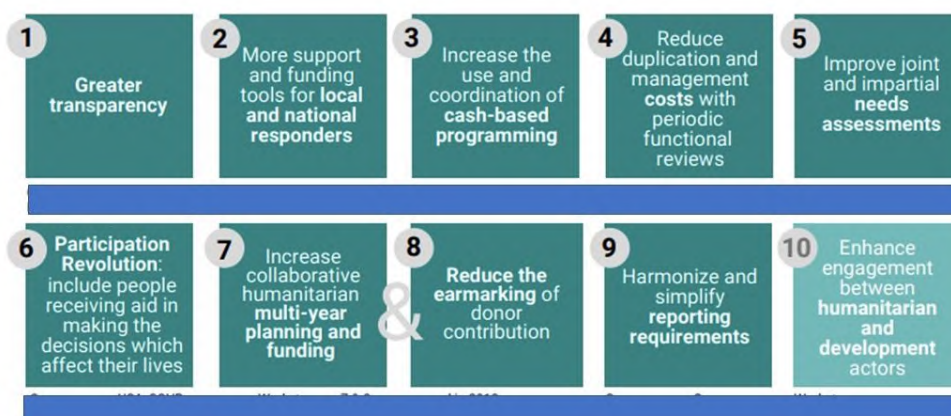

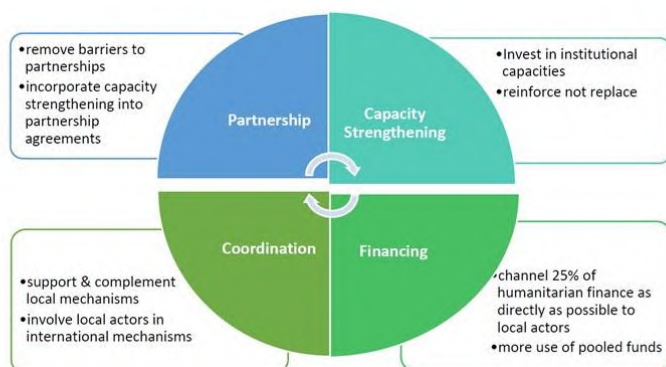

## GRAND BARGAIN ACHIEVEMENTS 2016-2021

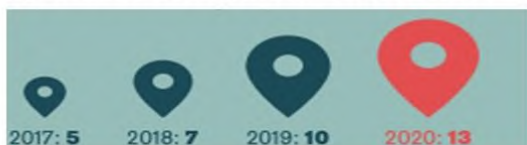

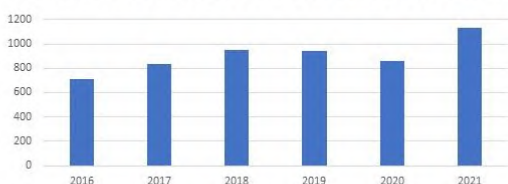

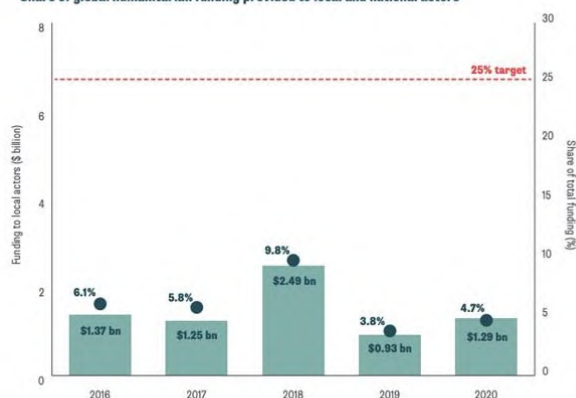
Signatories channeling at least 25% to local actors
