## Flash for October – Space Working Party

### Dear Colleagues

Thank you for your hard work in September. October — and autumn — is upon us, and we are happy to share a flash for the coming month.

We will begin October by cancelling our Space Working Party meeting on **1 October**, as we would prefer for you to spend the full day in the ECF subgroup, examining the space articles. Please coordinate with your local ECF delegate. Also, please note that we have shared a correspondence document mapping the links between the ECF space articles and existing (as well as expected) legislation.

On **7** and **14 October**, we will focus on the resilience aspects of the EUSA together with our cyber colleagues. On 7 October the Commission will be answering your questions on resilience, and on 14 October we have dedicated the full day to an examination of the resilience chapter, including Annex VII.

On **8 October (hybrid) and 15 October (online)**, the Commission is organising two workshops on the safety aspects of the EUSA, as well as the technical aspects of ISOS and orbital traffic rules, but excluding cyber. The target audience for these workshops will be experts from the capitals, but the workshops will also be relevant for attachés. These workshops will prepare us for our examination of Title IV, Chapter 1 on Safety that will take place in November.

From **20 to 22 October**, the attaché trip will provide us with an opportunity to get better acquainted with each other, with the space sector in Jutland, and with some of the region's key attractions, foods, and beverages.

On **27 October** we ask for your written comments and drafting suggestions for the Space Act Title IV, chap. II, III, IV, V and VI (articles 75 – 104) and Title VI (articles 109 – 112)

## Aalborg –

### “The Paris of the North”

Along the banks of the Limfjord lies Aalborg, a city that serves as a cultural centre for the region and a space hub for the entire country.

Visitors can take a stroll along the scenic harbour front or visit Kunsten Museum of Modern Art. Aalborg is particularly known for being a student city, with Aalborg University attracting students from across Denmark and around the world. The University has been pivotal in turning the port city with its traditional heavy industry into a modern knowledge and innovation-based economy.

As part of that transformation, Aalborg has become an exciting hub for the Danish space sector. The city is the home to several space technology companies, many of which have been spun out from the University.

Aalborg is also famous for its annual carnival, held on May 24th. During the carnival, the entire city bursts into celebration, with excited locals parading through the streets in colourful and creative costumes. Aalborg is perhaps equally famous or infamous for Jomfru Ane Gade (The Virgin Ane Street), a short street lined with bars with cheap(ish) booze making it the binge drinking capital for Northern Jutland.
