**Special Provisions (Articles 5 to 9), Definitions
(Article 2) and related recitals**

Multiannual Financial Framework 2028-2034

Articles 5 and 6 – Recital

Recital 13

***Resettlement and humanitarian admission** are safe and legal alternatives to irregular migration and a tool of European solidarity with countries that are not Member States and which host large numbers of persons fleeing war or persecution. Resettlement and humanitarian admission efforts by the Member States undertaken in the framework of Regulation (EU) 2024/1350 of the European Parliament and of the Council should be supported by appropriate funding from the Union's budget. In view of the specific nature of the support needed for purposes of resettlement and humanitarian admission and for the **transfer of applicants for international protection or of beneficiaries of international protection**, it is necessary to provide in this Regulation for pre-identified amounts per unit for such support.*



Article 5 – Resettlement and humanitarian admissions

- Wording aligned with the 2021-2027 AMIF Regulation (Article 19), as modified by the URF Regulation => **Continuity** with 2021-2027 support scheme.
- **National resettlement schemes** introduced by the URF Regulation.
- Levels of **amounts** of EU support:
 - EUR 10 000 per person for resettlement,
 - EUR 8 000 per person for HA and national resettlement schemes (vulnerable groups),
 - EUR 6 000 per person for humanitarian admissions and national resettlement schemes (standard cases)
- Light procedure for **amendments** of NRP Plans - No application of technical assistance flat rate (Article 31(7) NRP Plans Regulation).
- Precise modalities for applying the transfers to be defined following implementation of URF schemes in the current programming period.



Article 6 – Transfer of applicants for international protection or of beneficiaries of international protection

- Wording aligned with the 2021-2027 AMIF Regulation (Article 20), as modified by the AMMR Regulation => **Continuity** with 2021-2027 support scheme.
- Levels of **amounts** of EU support:
 - EUR 10 000 per person (applicant or beneficiary of international protection),
 - EUR 12 000 per person in case of unaccompanied minors (→ Introduced by the AMMR Regulation)
 - EUR 500 per person covering transfer costs (applicant or beneficiary of international protection and Dublin transfers → The latter introduced by the AMMR Regulation)
- Light procedure for **amendments** of NRP Plans - No application of technical assistance flat rate (Article 31(7) NRP Plans Regulation).
- Precise modalities for applying the transfers to be defined following implementation of relocation under the Annual Migration Cycle in the current programming period.



Article 7 – Third countries associated to the Union support (1)

Recital 16

A third country that has concluded an agreement with the Union on the criteria and mechanisms for establishing the State responsible for examining an application for international protection registered in a Member State or registered in that third country should be allowed to participate in the Union support through this Regulation provided certain conditions are fulfilled.



Article 7 – Third countries associated to the Union support (2)

- Same provisions as in 2021-2027 AMIF Regulation.
- **Two-step approach:**
 1. Conclusion of an agreement on the criteria and mechanisms for establishing the State responsible for examining an application for international protection registered in a Member State or registered in that third country (“Dublin agreement”).
 2. Conclusion of a specific agreement satisfying the minimum conditions detailed in paragraph 3.
- Associated third countries shall make **financial contributions** which will constitute assigned revenues.



Article 8 – European Migration Network

Recital 14

This Regulation should also ensure the continuation of the European Migration Network set up by Council Decision 2008/381/EC16 in accordance with its objectives and tasks.

- **Continuity** in the funding of European Migration Network activities.
- Support from the EU Facility in the form of grants to National Contact Points or procurement, based on work programmes adopted by the Commission.
- **Same modalities** for defining budget and work programmes as in the 2021-2027 programming period.



Article 9 – Annual Solidarity Pool (1)

Recital 15:

Given that Member States subject to migratory pressure should be able to rely on Union support, this Regulation should set out the rules in order to make available to benefitting Member States the respective share of the financial contributions included in the Annual Solidarity Pool established by Regulation (EU) 2024/1351 [Asylum and Migration Management Regulation - AMMR].



Article 9 – Annual Solidarity Pool

- The solidarity mechanism was **introduced by the AMMR** Regulation. First annual solidarity cycle is about to start.
- **Financial contributions to be channelled to the NRP Plans** of beneficiary Member States.
- **Scope of solidarity actions** defined in the AMMR Regulation (Article 56(2)(b) and 56(3)).



Article 2 – Definitions



- Limited to **key terms** under the different Articles.
- Definitions already existing in the 2021-2027 AMIF Regulation are **aligned with the Pact legislation**:
 - ✓ **AMMR** Regulation: “applicant for international protection”; “beneficiary of international protection”; “family member”; “third country national”; “unaccompanied minor”; “vulnerable person”; “benefitting Member State”; “contributing Member State”; “financial contributions”
 - ✓ Union Resettlement and Humanitarian Admission Framework Regulation (**URF** Regulation): “humanitarian admission”; “resettlement”;
 - ✓ **Temporary Protection** Directive: “temporary protection”
