Global approach to research & innovation Guiding principles

- **Openness** in research & innovation;
- Pool global efforts to tackle global challenges
- Common values, level playing fields and reciprocity: launched multilateral dialogue;
- Modulated cooperation with third countries: guide for participation in Horizon Europe (association, multilateral fora, targeting regions and countries, bottom-up participation, limitations);
- Science Diplomacy: Creating Team Europe Network





Global approach to research & innovation Implementation report

- First biennial report on the implementation of the Global Approach: adoption foreseen in mid-2023 (Commission report);
- Reports on progress in key areas identified in the Communication and on follow-up to Council Conclusions;
- Snapshot on EU position in international R&I cooperation across thematic areas, at multilateral and bilateral level;
- Analysis of the use of Art. 22(5) and Art. 22(6) of Horizon Europe.



CALLS ON the Commission and the European External Action Service to develop a 34. European Science Diplomacy Agenda and to present it to the Council, to explore designating science focal points in order to ensure adequate capacities for science in Union delegations, to foster cooperation with Member States' science counsellors in third countries, to consider involving representatives of the rotating Presidency in joint steering committee meetings, based on bilateral agreements between the Union and third countries, and to report to the Council on their progress by 2023; INVITES the Commission and the Member States to explore setting-up appropriate mechanisms for cooperation in the fields of science, innovation and cultural diplomacy in line with the recommendation of SFIC⁸ and other relevant expert organisations⁹; HIGHLIGHTS the importance of integrating the Global Approach in R&I in the Union's external action;

 Proposal for a European Science Diplomacy Agenda: adoption foreseen in mid-2023 (together with Global Approach implementation report);

Why?

- Non-binding, non-legislative, based on voluntary commitments;
- Forward-looking, suggesting concrete actions;
- Ownership and endorsement of the Council;
- EEAS associated.

What is the problem?

 Largely uncoordinated science diplomacy efforts in Europe, in a changing global context;

What is the objective?

• Better scientific expertise to advice foreign policies;

How to get there?

- Strengthening interactions between R&I and foreign policies;
- Mobilizing science for preventing or resolving conflicts and crises;
- Building capacity for European Science Diplomacy.

Multilateral Dialogue on Principles and Values in International R&I Cooperation



Global approach to research & innovation United States and Canada

United States:

- EU-US Joint Consultative Group meeting 12/10: positive momentum;
- Cooperation in the All-Atlantic Ocean Alliance and Mission Innovation, as well as in bilateral initiatives across policy areas;
- Extension of the EU-US S&T Agreement envisaged before expiry in October 2023.

Canada:

- EU-Canada Joint S&T Cooperation Committee meeting 18/10
- Step-up cooperation on SDGs agenda, climate change, pandemics,





Global approach to research & innovation China

China:

- Since launch of NBI, the **RWP** has been regularly updated;
- Progress on research framework conditions, but hardly any on innovation framework conditions;
- In absence of level-playing field, a transactional approach is proposed:
 - Push forth cooperation in **two jointly agreed research flagship initiatives** (on food, agriculture and biotechnologies; and on climate change and biodiversity);
 - Limitation of Chinese participation in innovation actions (Art. 22(6)) roughly 23% of actions in Work Programme 2023-24.
- Good work in EU-KNOC: upgrading EU knowledge on contemporary China; information on the ground from Science Counsellors.

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Global approach to research & innovation Japan and India

Japan:

- Strong relationship with Japan, underlined by successful visit of Commissioner Gabriel in early October;
- Close cooperation on values and principles in R&I: Japan will hold G7 Presidency in 2023;
- Increasing interest by Japan to engage in international R&I cooperation, to redress declining S&T performance.

India:

 While remaining a strategic partner, India has a very low participation in Horizon Europe due to lack of financing commitments;

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- India will have the G20 Presidency as of 1 December 2022 and will host Mission Innovation and Clean Energy Ministerials in 2023;
- EU-India Summit foreseen in 2023 (date to be set).



Global approach to research & innovation Russia

Russia:

- European Council of October 2022: unequivocal condemnation and firm rejection of Russia's escalating war;
- Suspension of scientific cooperation with Russia;
- Restrictions for the participation of Russian legal entities proposed to continue in Horizon WP 2023-24;
- People-to-people contacts, humanitarian aid and civil society actions in line with sanctions policy.





Global approach to research & innovation South Mediterranean

South Mediterranean:

- Adoption of **UfM Ministerial Declaration** at Ministerial Conference in June 2022. Priorities: health, climate change and renewable energies;
- A "**Mediterranean initiative**" is proposed in the Work Programme 2023-24 to encourage international R&I cooperation with South Mediterranean countries;
- **PRIMA**: report on the results of the interim evaluation is expected by the end of the year.





Global approach to research & innovation African Union-EU Innovation Agenda

Africa Union:

- Joint AU-EU Innovation Agenda as ongoing Non-Binding Instrument;
- Report on results of public consultation published on 25 October 2022. Stakeholder event in Nairobi on 23-24 November 2022;
- Innovation Agenda planned for adoption at the second AU-EU R&I Ministerial in June 2023 (date tbc), after endorsement by the Council;
- Discussed at dedicated session of UNGA Science Summit on 21 September 2022. Interest expressed by financial institutions;
- AU-EU College-to-College meeting planned for 28 November 2022.
 One of the roundtables is on health, education and research.





Global approach to research & innovation Latin America

Latin America:

- Implementation of the EU-CELAC 2021-2023 Strategic Roadmap for R&I on going. Priorities: global challenges, researcher mobility, research infrastructures, innovation;
- End-October 2022, EU-CELAC Foreign Ministers agreed on roadmap to upgrade relationship between both regions: "Road to 2023", towards EU-LAC Summit at HoSG level, in the second half of 2023.
- EU-CELAC Senior Officials Meeting under the Joint Initiative for Research and Innovation (date to be set).
