Subject:	Regulation amending Regulation (EU) No 1308/2013 (CMO) as regards the school scheme, sectoral interventions, the protein sector, hemp, marketing standards, import duties, the availability of supplies and securities - Comments from Luxembourg

Luxembourg comments on the proposal on the draft Regulation concerning financing of the Common Market Organization and School Scheme in the new programming period 2028+ on block 4 and block 3

BLOCK 4

Hemp (Article 1 (19), (20) and (21) (paragraph 3b), (27))

Articles 147b and 147c

Luxembourg welcomes the second paragraph of article 147b, as this would not interfere with national legislation on narcotics, which allows for the legal cultivation of non-medical cannabis for personal consumption in private persons domiciles.

On the other hand, we miss an identical paragraph in article 147c, in particular for the marketing of seeds, that do not meet the conditions of paragraph1(c).

Narcotic related matters, or smokable products, that do not interfere with the field of agriculture should not be regulated under common agricultural policy.

BLOCK 3

Sectoral interventions (Article 1 (12) (Art. 26, 30 to 35), (15), (18) , Article 3, Annex II)

Article 30

Luxembourg is opposed to mandatory interventions for recognized producer groups or associations of producer groups under paragraph 2. In a small member state, the limited size of different sectors would lead to administrative burden for such interventions that is out of proportion compared to the possible benefits.
