Gigabit Infrastructure Act (2023/0046(COD) 13-12-2023) LV written comments (22-12-2023)

Line 178 Article 7(5), first subparagraph

5. The competent authorities shall grant or refuse permits, other than rights of way, within <u>4[two/four]</u> months <u>[of expiry of the deadline set out in the second subparagraph] or within</u> the deadline set by national law, whichever is shorter.

Comment:

In line with the minimum harmonisation principle this Regulation must comply with the existing general rules regarding any construction in member states. The deadline may be shorter than 4 months if it is already shorter in national legislation. The text should include "4 months" together with principle of "shortest deadline applicable".

Line 193 Article 8(4)

4. Member States shall, *in consultation with operators and on the basis of industry best practices* adopt the relevant standards or technical specifications that are necessary for the implementation of paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 before [ENTRY INTO FORCE + 9 18 *MONTHS*]. Those standards or technical specifications *[shall/may] easily allow ordinary maintenance activities for the individual fibre wirings used by each operator to provide very high capacity network services and* shall set at least:

Comment:

At least 18 months are necessary to establish new standards or technical specifications.

Line 257 Article 18(2)

2. It shall apply from <u>24</u> months after <u>the date of</u> entry into force <u>of this Regulation</u>.

Comment:

The time for implementing new rules on reporting and permit granting conditions in case of civil works (which currently have no reporting obligations); and implementing new legislation on technical specifications; and for technical and practical implementation of digitalisation provisions into existing legislation, there is necessity that this regulation enters into force no less than in 24 months.
