Consultation on revised Presidency text on Chapter VI (ST 5652/25) and Chapter V of Annex I (ST 5651/25)

During the meeting of the Working Party on Animal and Veterinary Questions (Animal Welfare & Husbandry) on 5-6 February 2025, the Polish Presidency presented new texts on Chapter VI of the Regulation and on Chapter V of Annex I (ST 56252/25 and ST 5651/25) of the proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on the protection of animals during transport and related operations.

Following the discussion at the Working Party meeting, the Presidency introduced a few minor changes to the text aimed at harmonising the wording, correcting the obvious errors or clarifying the text. Those changes have been **highlighted** in the text; in addition, added new words appear in ***bold, underlined and italics***.

This new, slightly amended Presidency text is the basis for this consultation launched on the Delegates Portal (in the format of a Word table).

Written comments which will be submitted by the delegations shall be used for drafting a new Presidency text of Chapter VI of the Regulation and of Chapter V of Annex I, to be presented at the upcoming meeting of the Working Party on Animal and Veterinary Questions (Animal Welfare & Husbandry) on 2-3 April 2025.

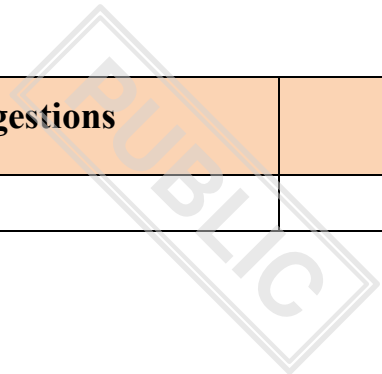

<p>1. Animals of equine, bovine, ovine, caprine, and porcine species <u>Feeding and watering of weaned terrestrial animals and domestic birds poultry</u></p>		
<p>1.1. Attendants or drivers shall provide <u>weaned</u> equine animals with feed and water ad libitum or at least at regular intervals of no more than 4,5 hours for a period of 30 minutes while the vehicle is stationary. The same watering and feeding regime shall be maintained during transport by <u>the leg of the journey that takes</u></p>

<p><u>place at</u> sea.</p>		
<p>1.2. Attendants or drivers shall provide <u>weaned</u> animals of bovine, ovine, caprine and porcine species with water ad libitum during the journey or during the rest periods laid down in Article 27. Feed shall be offered to animals during the rest periods <u>provided for in Article 27(1)(c)</u> while the vehicle is stationary and when <u>the</u> animals are unloaded. The same watering and feeding regime shall be maintained during transport by sea. <u>For the leg of the journey that takes places at sea, weaned animals of bovine, ovine, caprine and porcine species shall be fed every 10 hours.</u></p>		
<p>1.3. For <u>domestic birds poultry</u> and rabbits, <u>suitable feed and water shall be available in adequate quantities.</u></p>

Species other than those referred to in points 1 to 3 shall be transported in accordance with written instructions <u>provided by the keeper at the place of origin</u> about feeding and watering and taking into account any special care required.
